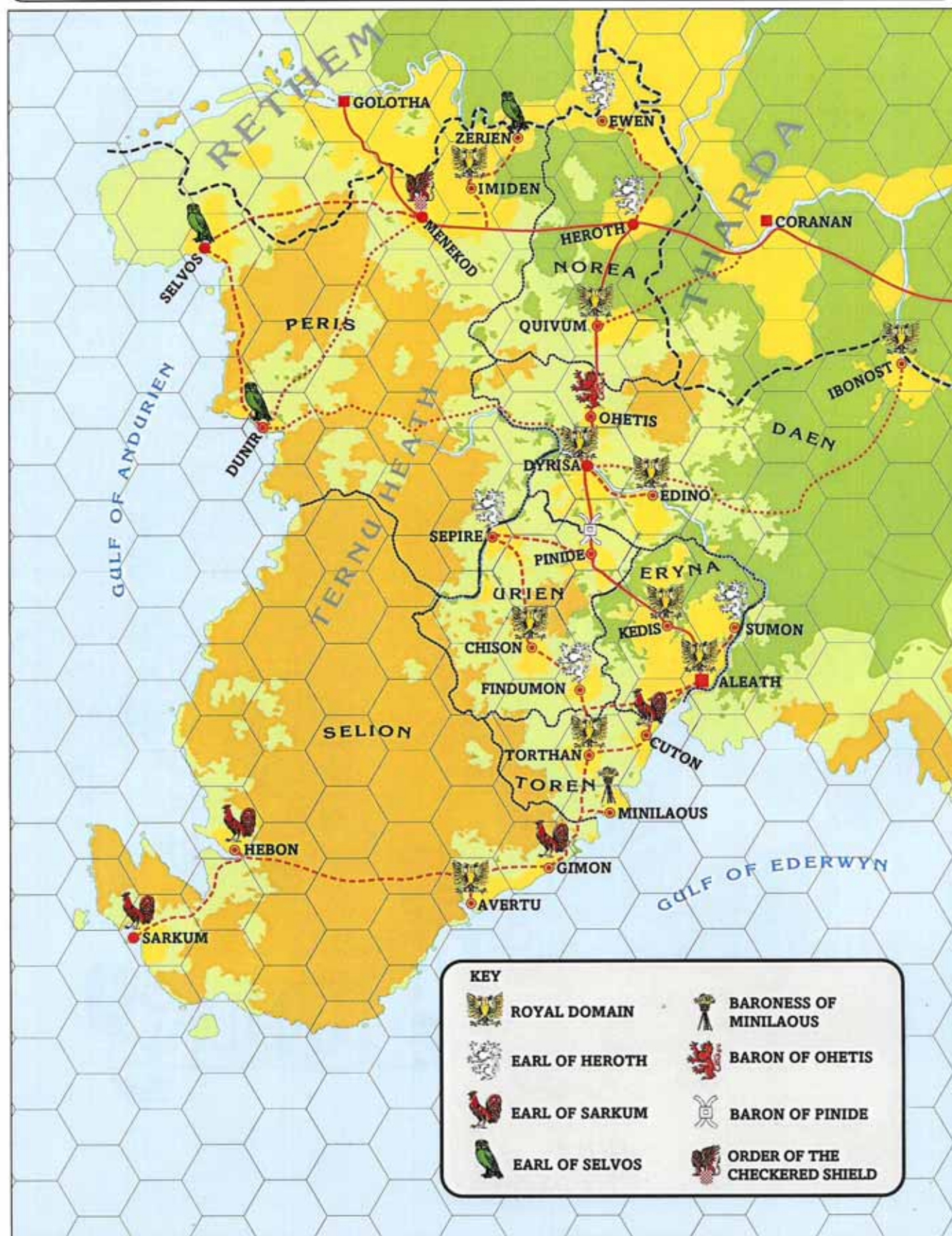


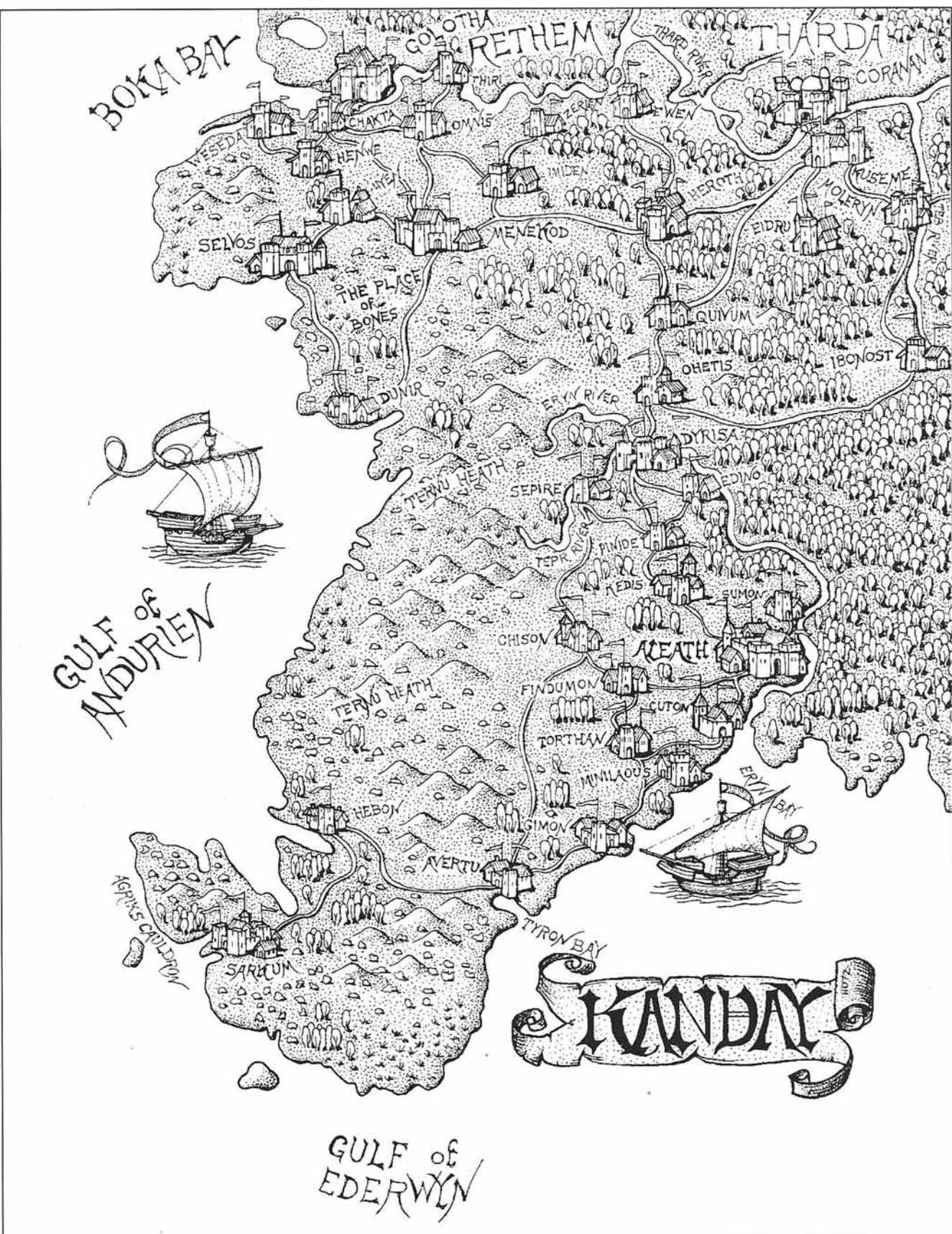

anday is a feudal kingdom in southwestern Hårn. Founded in 589 after the collapse of the Theocracy of Tekhos, Kanday is ruled by the House of Kand. King Andasin IV keeps his seat at Dyrisa. He is a learned ruler but is perceived to be weak and dominated by his father, the Earl of Sarkum. The city of Aleath is the largest settlement.

The kingdom is bounded roughly by the Thard and Teb Rivers in the north and east, the Gulf of Andurien in the west and the Gulf of Ederwyn in the south. The name Kanday derives from the name of the ruling clan. Previously, the region was known as Aleathia.

Kanday is bordered to the northwest by the kingdom of Rethem, and to the northeast by the Thardic Republic. Kanday has a tradition of enlightened and peaceful government, but foreign relations are another matter. The kingdom has been involved in three major wars over the past 60 years. The king dislikes war, but has been unable to halt the ongoing bloody skirmishes between the orders of the *Checkered Shield* and the *Copper Hook* along the Rethemi border. This conflict stems from Ezar's War (682-97) when Kanday defeated Rethem and seized significant territory from the Agrikan order. The rise to power of King Chafin III of Rethem may herald the onset of another full scale war with Kanday. To complicate matters, Kanday recently suffered defeat during the Kuseme War (712-13) at the hands of the Thardic Republic. King Andasin's greatest fear is an alliance between his two northern rivals.

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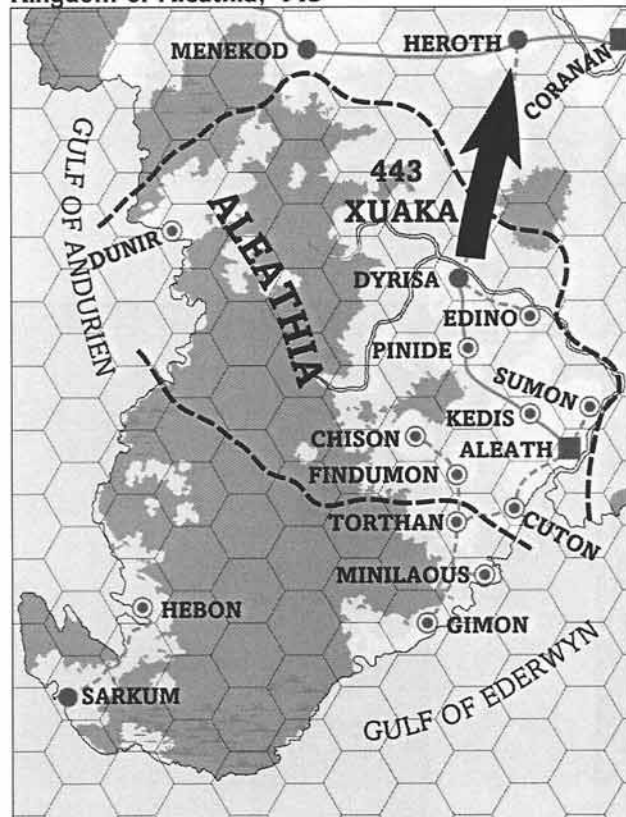
HISTORY

There were Jarin peoples living in southwestern Hårn by 1000 BT. After the end of the Atani Wars in the seventh century BT, the region absorbed an influx of eastern Jarin and Lythian peoples. By the first century TR there were several dozen tribes in the area. For the next two centuries a number of petty "kingdoms" rose and fell as warrior chieftains struggled for dominance; few states outlived their founders.

About 350 the Aleta tribe of the southern Eryn River valley unified under the chieftain Alash. Little is known of Alash. He is described as "...a gentle man, fond of beauty and harmony...." This assessment is speculative; it is likely that Alash was more pragmatic. In 356 he founded Aleath and the kingdom of Aleathia.

By 393, after annexations and conquests by Alash and his son Calin, Aleathia extended north to the Eryn River and west to Sarkum. In 429 Xuaka became the fifth monarch of Aleathia and embarked on an ambitious policy of expansion along the west coast, an area in dispute with the Corani Empire. When the Corani Emperor Laketta died in 443, Xuaka invaded the Empire, seizing Heroth. The Corani chose Mejenes, a brilliant military leader, as their emperor, and a bitter war began.

Xuaka was a skilled general, but the resources of the empire and the talents of Mejenes were too great to overcome. By 447 Xuaka was penned in Aleath while Corani armies ravaged his kingdom. He was forced to accept Mejenes' peace terms, stipulating that Aleathia would be restored to its pre-war borders during Xuaka's life but then be annexed by the empire.

When Xuaka died in 453 the treaty was honored and Aleathia became a province of the empire. During the hundred and twelve years of Imperial rule the region prospered. Many of the paved roads and stone bridges date from this period. Also during this time, the fabled city of Fenyryn was constructed by Workol the Astrologer.

The Theocracy of Tekhos

Aleathia escaped most of the disasters that struck the north during the mid-sixth century. As a result, the Balshan Jihad, which fed upon despair and unrest, had little success in the south. The Empire, however, was doomed. The end came in 565 with the fall of Coranan and the execution of the Emperor Medak.

The collapse of central authority caused chaos everywhere. In the city of Aleath, a republic was founded and attempts were made to create a unified opposition to the Balshans. Unfortunately, the Republic was unable to gather significant support. When Horahnam emerged as leader of the Theocracy of Tekhos in 568, Aleath's fate was sealed. Seeking to eliminate any possible threat from the city, Horahnam marched south in 569. The fortresses in his path either surrendered or were overwhelmed and Aleath was soon besieged.

The Agony of Aleath

The city held out for three bitter years with no hope of relief. Starvation and disease reduced the defenders to desperation. When it was obvious Aleath was doomed, hundreds slew themselves and their kin rather than be captured. In the spring of 572 the Tekhosians breached the walls, and in a grisly orgy of butchery, rape, and pillage, massacred most of the remaining population. This atrocity was described by Horahnam of Tekhos as the "savage and righteous vengeance of Morgath".

Aleathian Odyssey

A few Aleathians escaped due to Rolin and Taryn of Melesen, brothers who had immigrated from Melderyn in 552. They operated a mercantiling business and owned a number of ships. When Aleath was besieged, they advocated a plan to escape the city by sea. One month before Aleath fell, 400 adults chosen by lot, and most children under twelve, boarded and sailed eastward.

Foul weather scattered the fleet and over half the vessels were lost. Many legends recount the fate of lost ships, and tales of sunken treasure scattered along the south coast of Hårn. Maps occasionally turn up purporting to show the location of a wreck. The most fanciful legend is that of the Halflings. Seamen tell of a race of half-sized folk who reside on an island in the Gulf of Ederwyn. It is likely that the origin of the tale was the shipwreck of some children during the Odyssey. The surviving ships gathered at Keboth Island where they were aided by the Sindarin. There they met Genin, a mage of Melderyn, and under his guidance they sailed east to found the city of Thay in 573.

Eladas of Kand "the Faithful"

The rule of the Theocracy was harsh and brutal. Thousands were impaled or forced into outlawry. Perverse Morgathian spectacles and executions become commonplace, and the tribunals and inquisitors that enforced the new order were greatly feared. Those of the old Imperial nobility that survived either embraced the Theocracy or fled into exile.

When the empire fell, Eladas of Kand, a deputy governor of Aleathia province, declared that without an emperor to dismiss him, he would serve until a proper authority appeared. When the armies of the Theocracy crossed the Eryn, Eladas declared his loyalty to Horahnam. He was allowed to maintain Edino Keep, but was never trusted.

For six years Eladas sheltered enemies of the Theocracy, and began to establish a small army of refugees in the Mimea Hills. In 575 Eladas was summoned before the Dyrisa tribunal to answer charges of heresy and treason. Knowing the inevitable result of such a summons, Eladas sent his family and retainers to safety in the Mimea Hills and calmly accepted his fate. He was tortured and impaled, and his mutilated body was thrown into the Eryn; clan Kand was declared outlaw.

Andasin I

The leadership of clan Kand fell to the eldest son, Andasin. He trained a small army of desperate refugees and harassed the forces of the Theocracy. The Tekhosians made several attempts to eliminate him but failed due to rugged terrain and the friendship between clan Kand and the Gozyda tribesmen in the area.

When the Theocracy collapsed in 588, Andasin struck, seizing Ibonost from its Tekhosian governor in the first month of 589. He founded the House of Kand and proclaimed the kingdom of Kanday with himself as king. For the next decade, aided by the chaotic conditions of the Interregnum, Andasin extended his power.

In 598 Andasin felt secure enough to attack Edino keep, which was held by the warlord Taklar Zedabas. Taklar's well deserved reputation for vicious brutality had won him the sobriquet "Ogre", and he was one of the most skillful military commanders in the area.

Andasin, having lived at Edino, knew its defenses well, and his night assault in small boats across the Eryn River took Taklar by surprise. The battle for control of the keep was merciless; few of Taklar's men survived. The Ogre of Edino was slain in the attack, cut down on the roof of the keep.

Following this triumph Andasin conquered or annexed much of the surrounding area. He was a genius at siege warfare and by 615 had isolated his only significant rival, the Morgathian lords of Dyrisa castle. In the spring of 620 Andasin marched to Dyrisa and besieged it. Dyrisa surrendered three months later, after its overlord, Asagran, was murdered by his followers.

In 622, Andasin, a devout Laranian, founded the *Order of the Checkered Shield* to defend northern Kanday. The order quickly attracted many members and within five years captured Quivum, Imiden, Ewen, Zerien, and Heroth for Kanday. About 624 Andasin began to decline into senility. He died in 627.

Andasin II

All of Andasin's sons had perished in battle. His successor was his grandson Maradon, who took the name Andasin II. Unlike his predecessor, Kanday's second king was more inclined to negotiation than war. He made alliances with the numerous petty states on his borders, including a second Aleath Republic, which joined the kingdom as a chartered freetown in 633. The *Violet Mantle Palace of Arms* dates from his reign. When Andasin II died in 654, Kanday was a strong, vigorous kingdom, firmly allied with its neighbors.

Ashenan

Andasin II never married. On his death the kingship passed to his brother Ashenan. King Arlun of Rethem seized the opportunity offered by the transition to attack Dunir, an independent ally of Kanday, but otherwise Ashenan's reign was quiet and unmarked by strife. When he died after a five year reign the kingdom's succession council gave the throne to his wife Arelora.

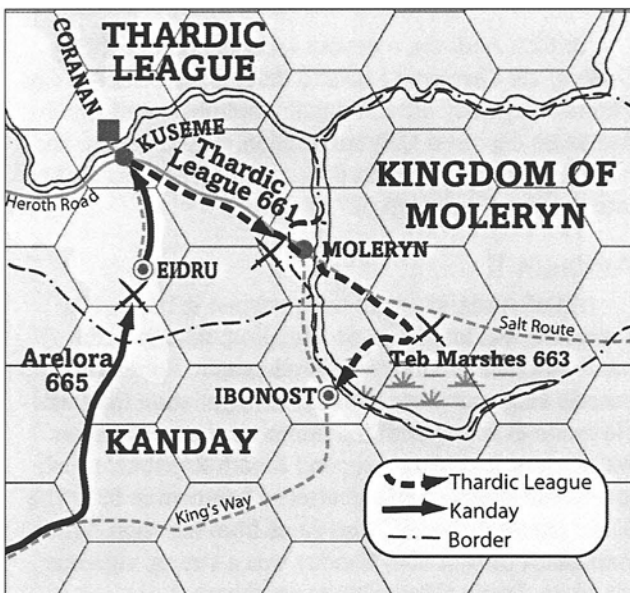
Arelora and the Five Year War

It is sometimes speculated that the motivation to make Arelora queen was based on an assumption that she could be easily manipulated. Although the first few years of her reign show little sign of her influence, she soon emerged as a skilled and willful leader.

In 661 the Thardic League conquered Moleryn, then a minor ally of Kanday. Arelora demanded the immediate withdrawal of League forces. The ultimatum was ignored and Kanday declared what has become known as the Five Year War. For the first two years, dozens of minor skirmishes took place and Arelora left the conduct of the war to her lieutenants. This resulted in a disorganized Kandian army being soundly beaten at the battle of the Teh Marshes in 663 and the loss of Ibonost, which infuriated Arelora. She took personal command of her demoralized army.

The sight of the diminutive fifty-two year old queen, bedecked in silver armour and making stirring speeches, rallied Kanday. After two more years of war she brought the League to battle near Eidru and inflicted an ignominious defeat on Colura, the Thardic Autarch.

Five Year War, 661-666



With the League armies routed, Arelora took Eidru. A company of Kandian knights captured Kuseme when its defenders panicked and failed to close the gates. Only the Thard River checked Arelora's advance. The League sued for peace, and in 666 the Treaty of Quivum gave Eidru and Kuseme to Kanday, while the League kept Moleryn. Ibonost was returned to Kanday. Both sides claimed victory. The remainder of Arelora's reign was peaceful. She died childless in 676.

Andasin III

Andasin III's claim to the throne was somewhat tenuous, being the son of Melise, the bastard daughter of Kubro, Andasin I's second son. Melise had been acknowledged by her grandfather in 620 after Kubro was killed during a skirmish at Dyrisa.

Andasin III, deeply affected by Melise's bastardy, was obsessed with his origins. He ordered an investigation, in which the heralds of the House of Kand provided evidence of his descent from the kings of Aleathia.

Ezar's War, 682-697



In 682, the Agrikan Order of the Copper Hook attacked Kanday, besieging Imiden, which was relieved by the Laranian Order of the Checkered Shield. King Puril of Rethem supported the Agrikan aggression, and the fifteen-year conflict known as Ezar's War (after the Copper Hook grandmaster) began.

The rival armies engaged repeatedly but without much effect along the northern border of Kanday. Neither was able to bring the other to battle on favorable ground. In 688 Puril broke the stalemate by moving an army by sea to Sarkum, then a minor ally of Kanday. The Rethemi quickly overwhelmed Sarkum and Hebon, but Puril was mortally wounded by Gemalan king, Ranald Milaka, succumbing in 689.

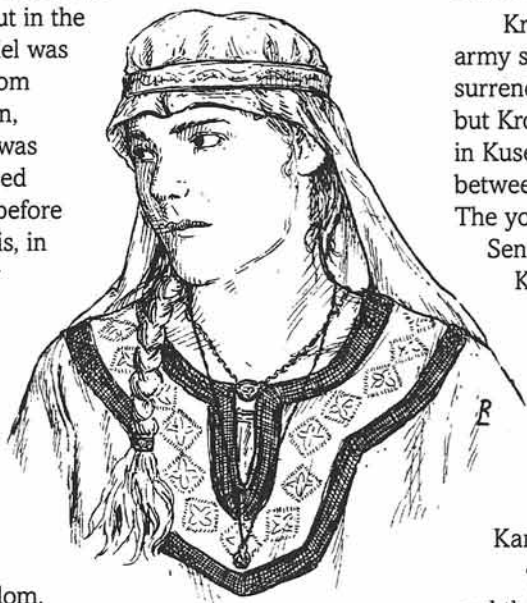
Puril's death gave Andasin III time to arrange the marriage of his daughter Mirelael to Ranald Milaka, the deposed ruler of Sarkum, and secure the fealty of the petty states west of Aleath. His renewed forces besieged Sarkum before Kabe could arrive to take command. In 690, Andasin III recaptured Hebon but the king was killed in the final assault. Ranald Milaka, was heroic in the assault.

Now surrounded by Kanday, the minor kingdoms of Alatar and Mezant swore fealty to Andasin III.

Eriel

Andasin III was succeeded by his eldest daughter Eriel. The Kandians rallied to the beautiful, charismatic twenty-two year old woman, and her visits to the besieging army at Sarkum are still remembered with awe. In 692, fire broke out in Sarkum castle and Kabe of Rethem was killed. The castle surrendered, but the war continued in the north. Kanday took Dunir in 693, but otherwise the northern frontier remained deadlocked.

Kabe's successor Chafin I, determined to win the war by any means, instructed the Agrikan *Order of the Crimson Dancer* to assassinate Eriel. The murder was carried out in the last month of 694; Eriel was slain in her sewing room at Dyrisa. The assassin, Brenlyn of Shernath, was captured and implicated Chafin I in the crime before she was executed. This, in addition to the widely believed (and never denied) rumor that Eriel's body had been mutilated, outraged Kanday. Eriel's crown, adorned with *Eladas' Eye*, a fiery black opal dating from the founding of the Kingdom, vanished and has never been recovered.

Mirelael

Mirelael, Eriel's younger sister, came to the throne in a storm of fury against Rethem. Kandian armies captured Menekod and Selvos in the spring of 695, causing Chafin to sue for peace. The 697 Treaty of Selvos ended the war and established the present border. Mirelael devoted the remainder of her reign to rebuilding the shattered economy of Kanday and establishing peace. She was successful in both aims but the effort exhausted her. She died of a fever in 707, at only thirty-seven years old, and was widely grieved.

Andasin IV

Andasin IV, Mirelael's eldest son, succeeded his mother at the age of 17. Since coming to the throne he has often been influenced by the advice of his father, Sir Ranald Milaka, Earl of Sarkum. This was particularly true during the first years of his reign.

Kuseme War

In 712 the Earl of Kuseme, Ernald Julor, sent a band of knights to assert control over two disputed villages east of Eidru. Kronas, the Marshal of the neighboring Thardic Republic province of Ramala, sensed an opportunity, and moved to challenge the earl.

Kronas' supporters in the Thardic Senate made appeals for support of the Marshal. The fact that Kuseme castle (lost by the Republic in the Five Year War) is clearly visible from Coranan and linked to the city by Kobar bridge prompted the Senate to act and Kronas was ordered to retake Kuseme.

Kronas besieged Kuseme but moved the bulk of his army south to seize Eidru, forcing the surprised earl to surrender. The onset of a bitter winter ended hostilities but Kronas continued the siege causing great hardship in Kuseme. Meanwhile, negotiations were taking place between Andasin IV and elements of the Thardic Senate. The young king was eager to offer peace, and the Senators, wishing to contain the growing power of Kronas, also desired an end to the war. Andasin's inexperience resulted in him offering both Kuseme and Eidru to the Republic in exchange for peace. A more skillful politician might have minimized the loss to Kuseme or even negotiated a withdrawal of Republican forces. In any event, before war could be renewed in the spring, peace was concluded between Kanday and the Republic.

The settlement infuriated the Marshal of Ramala and the Earl of Kuseme. Kronas believed that he could have conquered all of Kanday, and that the Senate had acted out of jealousy and fear; the earl believed that he could have withstood a lengthy siege in Kuseme, and that given proper support from his king he could have driven Kronas back across the Teb. Kronas was placated by granting him the offices of Marshal and Magistrate of the new province of Eidrel, formed from the lands surrendered by Kanday. The earl was reduced to a single holding, Ohetis Keep, and the title of baron.

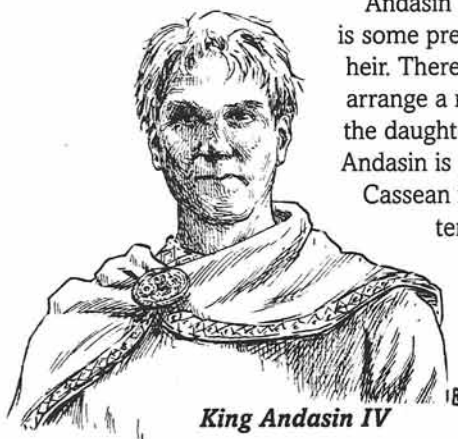
When the peace was announced the reduced earl was rumored to have made private accusations that the king had not honored his feudal obligations, and had shown cowardice in ceding Kuseme and Eidru. Many of the great clans of Kanday, particularly those holding lands along the Rethem border, were disturbed by the settlement of the Kuseme War. Some fear Andasin IV is too eager for peace and will give up anything to appease his neighbors. The fact that Lord Julor was not widely liked and was commonly regarded as a braggart has softened the feeling that Andasin acted too hastily.

PRESENT SITUATION

Some Kandian lords are troubled by the power of the king's father, the Earl of Sarkum. His influence over Andasin IV is considerable, and although his judgement is not in question, there is some jealousy, particularly by those who view him as an upstart. Ranald Milaka was the King of Gemala before the capture of Sarkum by the Rethemi during Ezar's War. His marriage to Mirelael and swearing of fealty to Andasin III are the origin of his present title. In 717, the earl's daughter, Andasin IV's sister, was married to Jervas Toron, the son of the king of Melderyn.

For the last seven years the Baron of Ohetis (the disgraced former Earl of Kuseme) has been a loyal vassal, although there is no doubt he harbors resentment towards his liege. While it is unlikely that he would act against Andasin, he would no doubt prefer Prince Anaflas as king.

This opinion is shared by several others, as Anaflas is widely seen as more pragmatic and energetic than his elder brother. Many believe that he would be the leader of preference should war break out. Although the brothers are not fond of each other, there is no open hostility, and since 718 Anaflas has been the Sheriff of Peris, holding Imiden keep for the king.



King Andasin IV

Andasin IV is unmarried, and there is some pressure on him to provide an heir. There are negotiations underway to arrange a marriage between the king and the daughter of Earl Cassean of Heroth. Andasin is privately reluctant; Dortha Cassean is as well known for her shrewish temper as for her beauty. Presently, the heir to the throne is Anaflas, who has also been named heir to the Earldom of Sarkum.

Relations between Kanday and her neighbors are tense, but they are peaceful. Although there has been

frequent skirmishing across the Rethem-Kanday border between the rival orders of the *Copper Hook* and the *Checkered Shield* since the end of Ezar's War, neither monarch officially recognizes the conflict nor supports the combatants. Both claim it is a religious dispute, although should either order make substantive gains it is likely that the secular governments would become involved. The Rethemi Earl of Tormau, who detests Chafin III, has been covertly giving aid to both orders to keep the conflict simmering. He has also approached Anaflas, through intermediaries, to explore alternatives should war break out between Kanday and Rethem.

Andasin IV fears the martial skills and expansionist designs of Marshal Kronas of the Thardic Republic. The problem is made greater by the erratic (from Andasin's point of view) policies of the Thardic Senate. Andasin fears that the pro-Kronas and Imperial factions will gain dominance. His greatest worry is an alliance of his northern neighbors against him.

Kanday and Tharda are also at odds over the range of the Gozyda tribesmen. Andasin I swore an oath that his kingdom would always defend the Gozyda. The republic claims most of the Gozyda lands and occasionally capture them as slaves.

King Andasin IV

Andasin IV, eldest son of Sir Ranald "Kingslayer" Milaka and the late Queen Mirelael, is a brilliant scholar and administrator, but an uninspiring leader. Some say his fiery brother Anaflas is his father's son, and the more cerebral Andasin is his mother's son.

Andasin was clearly his mother's favorite son. As a lad, he was invited to spend many late nights listening to his mother conferring with her advisors or simply thinking aloud. As he grew, his knowledge of the kingdom came to rival hers. By the time of her death when he was seventeen, he had become respected in the court for his knowledge and analytical ability. In the thirteen years since his accession to the throne, he has presided over a peaceful and prosperous time. Relations with the Mangai are excellent, and Aleath's growth has led to prosperity throughout the Eryn Valley and through much of the kingdom. Wealthy Kandian mercantylers now hold significant interests in a number of Thardan and Rethemi commercial ventures; it is said that not a penny changes hands in Western Hårn, but that Andasin gets a farthing of it.

Andasin is a regular adherent of the church of Save K'nor. He maintains an uneasy public relationship with the powerful Laranian church for political and military reasons, and the constant threat of his displeasure has been an indirect stimulus for the church's significant development of Shreve and Erone as prosperous centers for the production of fine woolens. It was the wily old Serolan Royal, Sir Boromis Telfane, who said "His Highness can do more hurt to our enemies with cold silver than with cold steel".

Sir Ranald Milaka, the Earl of Sarkum and Andasin's father, knows that Andasin makes a better king than his mercurial younger brother Anaflas. He supports Andasin's commitment to peace, but fears that the intricate commercial network could be destroyed by laws written in the panic of war. To dissuade their enemies, Sir Ranald advises the king to show a more visible military presence along the northern border. Andasin resists, mindful of the folly of the Earl of Kuseme and the cost of resolving crises caused by hotheaded men in armour.

NATURAL RESOURCES

Kanday is not blessed with an abundance of natural resources. Rainfall is regular and water is plentiful and of good quality, but the frequent storms leave the roads and structures in constant need of repair. Wind and water power are both widely used for mills, the former along the western coast and highlands, and the latter in the populated river valleys.

Away from the Thard and Eryn valleys, the land is seldom fertile and is better suited to sheep rearing than to intensive agriculture. Grain production is predominantly rye, barley, and oats; wheat does not fare well here. Mineral deposits are widespread but not especially rich.

Ternu Heath

The vast Ternu Heath is underexplored and underexploited. It is an inhospitable area of scrubby woodland, ponds and bogs of all sizes, and fire-scarred areas hundred of acres in extent.

The Ternu Heath is covered by an uneven patchwork of stunted scabby scrub oaks and twisted pitch pines that seldom reach ten feet in height, useless as timber and of limited use to charcoalers. Shrubs include a few varieties of blueberry, heather, and hardy azalea. The sandy soil's drier stretches are carpeted with tough bearberry, while pond shores and bogs support cranberry and wintergreen.

Upland areas exposed to the prevailing west wind are dry even after the frequent early-morning fogs. These areas are subject to and reliant upon fire; the pitch pines are highly flammable, and their cones do not even open until they have been subjected to a wildfire. Fires spread rapidly, fanned by the omnipresent winds and limited only by the frequent bogs, ponds, and minor waterways that crisscross the heath.

Thousands of small ponds dot the landscape, some transformed over the years into bogs. The sheltered lowland areas are humid and cool, supporting a wide variety of hanging and ground-mosses, carnivorous plants, and fungi. Trees seldom grow tall in the thin, infertile soil, and many areas are effectively impassable due to rotting fallen logs. Pockets of richer acid soils support white cedar, where hunters know to seek deer in the winter. There is incredible diversity in these areas, and some apothecaries and hired herbalists endure great hardship and privation to acquire the treasures growing here.

The heath is home to foxes, raccoons, mink and other small mammals. There are several species of turtles and snakes, especially in the dry uplands, but only the Heath Adder is poisonous. Frogs and salamanders are relatively few, their fertility diminished by the acid waters of the bogs, and their numbers checked by constant predation from herons, raccoons, turtles, snakes, and almost anything else that can catch them. The eagle is the king of the birds, a large realm that includes scores of migratory songbirds, wading birds, gamebirds, and shorebirds.

Heathside settlements acquire much of their fuel from cutting and drying peat from the older bogs.

Exposure

To man, the most dangerous foe on the Ternu Heath is exposure brought on by the deadly combination of wind and water.

Some of the oldest bogs are quaking bogs, so overgrown with thick moss that a lightly armoured man can walk across the surface. The vegetation cannot truly support the weight at any appreciable distance from the shore; the moment it starts quaking underfoot it is too late to escape. The hapless pedestrian is plunged into the icy dark water below, which can be knee-deep or as deep as twelve feet, with a thick, heavy muck at the bottom. The floating vegetation, still unable to bear the weight, must be cut away as the victim wades blindly toward shore. Once soaked, the incessant wind can bring on deadly hypothermia and death in under a watch.

ECONOMIC DATA

The castles and keeps of Kanday listed above either produce a Surplus (S), Demand (D), or are self-sufficient (•) in each of the 13 listed commodities.

The information is derived from natural resources such as minerals, forests and fish, fertility, and the geopolitical situation. For example, settlements which maintain large garrisons demand preserved food, while coastal areas with access to salt pans produce it.

Gamemasters can use this economic information to generate realistic mercantile activity in a campaign.

Market Days and Fairs

The bulk of Kanday's rural business transactions occur on market days and at fairs in settlements across the kingdom. Market days are held in most keeps four times monthly on each Peonian Lesser Sapelah, and daily in the castletowns. Traditionally, business between guildsmen is conducted in the morning while the produce and livestock from surrounding manors clogs the roads and gates leading into the settlement. By afternoon, the guildsmen are finished with their transactions and are free to examine the goods available at the market, and to hire labor to move the goods they have purchased.

Fairs are much larger market days, held seasonally in the castles and abbeys that have been licensed to hold them. Kandian fairs are usually centered upon a single guild or commodity, such as wool, parchment, linen, wine/cider, or grain. In addition to their commercial significance, fairs are centers of religion and local folk culture. Much more food, drink, and entertainment are seen than on a typical market day, and religious events always feature prominently. Some fairs include tournaments of chivalry, but these are rare and tightly controlled by the Laranian Church.

RELIGION

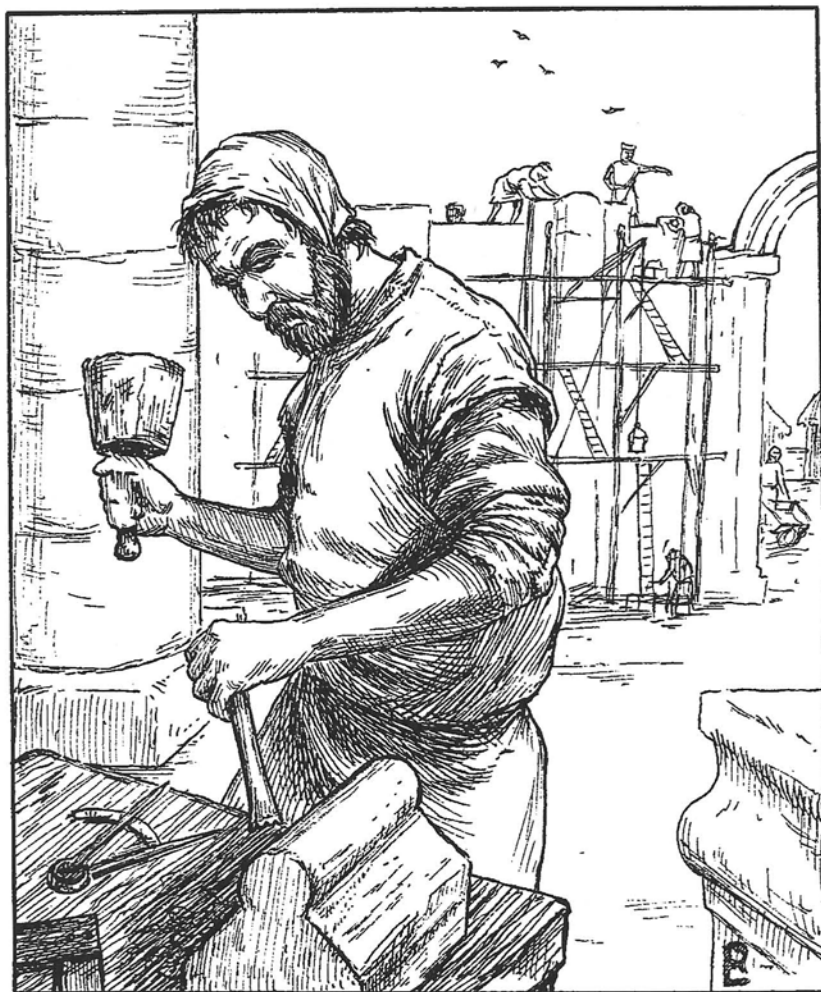
The religious climate of Kanday is dominated by the church of Larani. Despite the ambivalence of the current monarch, the relationship between the throne and the church has been very strong; Kandian monarchs have valued the military and civil benefits of church support. Other faiths occupy less favored positions.

Worship of Peoni is popular among the common folk of Kanday. Peonians are disinterested in secular politics, but the church is respected by Kandian nobility. The Peonian Mepeleh (primate) is in Thay, creating communication problems with western Hârn. There is a petition before the Peonian Hapalan (pontiff) to create a western Hârnic Primacy, headquartered in Aleath. A decision is expected in 721.

The churches of Save-K'nor and Halea maintain wealthy temples in Kanday, but their appeal among the masses is limited. Worship of Ilvir and Sarajin is discouraged everywhere and proscribed in Perishire. Worship of Agrik, Morgath, and Naveh is punishable by death, but banishment is more common if no other crimes are involved.

Clothing and Dress

The peasantry have few opportunities to express their ideals of beauty and style. The wool industry drives up the cost of both imported and locally-made dyes, and only common herbal dyes find wide usage. The settlements along the windward shore from Sarkum to Selvos are especially far removed from urban centers; fashions are slow to change there. The heavy collared cloak and the sensible Korbi (a warm, brimless, woolen cap) are favorites of the folk of the western shores. Those of the lonely sheep country south of the Eryna River prefer wide-brimmed sheepskin hats and lighter cloaks. Fashion in the wealthier, more densely populated Eryna Valley is much like that in the more cosmopolitan Thard Valley to the north, exhibiting greater variety and color.

The class-conscious freemen of Kanday take pains to differentiate themselves from their unfree neighbors. Guildsmen sport woollens of the brightest reds and blues available. Merchants belonging to the Halean church tend to visibly wear something of the locally-made Eryn Yellow. Few others wear this attractive color and much yellow cloth is exported. Kandian nobility are especially flamboyant. Women and younger men wear their hair as long as possible, and wavy blonde hair is considered the most beautiful. Long hair is a sign of virility, and some aging noblemen attempt to hide advancing baldness. Gray or silver hair is valued as a mark of experience. Girls and boys wear their hair short until they reach adulthood. By contrast, scholars shun flamboyant dress and prefer their hair short.

Virtually all adult nobles wear perfumes, often in prodigious quantities, as a sign of status. Most clothing is of brightly-colored wool with silk lining. Blousons of silk and fine Emelrene linen are standard wear in the court of Andasin IV. Fox fur is easily obtained and a mark of low esteem; mink and sable are preferred for linings and collars. Sealskin is worn only by the families of the earls and the royal family. Wearing something inappropriate can lead to embarrassment at best, and at worst it can cause some to question whether one is truly highborn.

KANDAY 12

FOOD AND DRINK

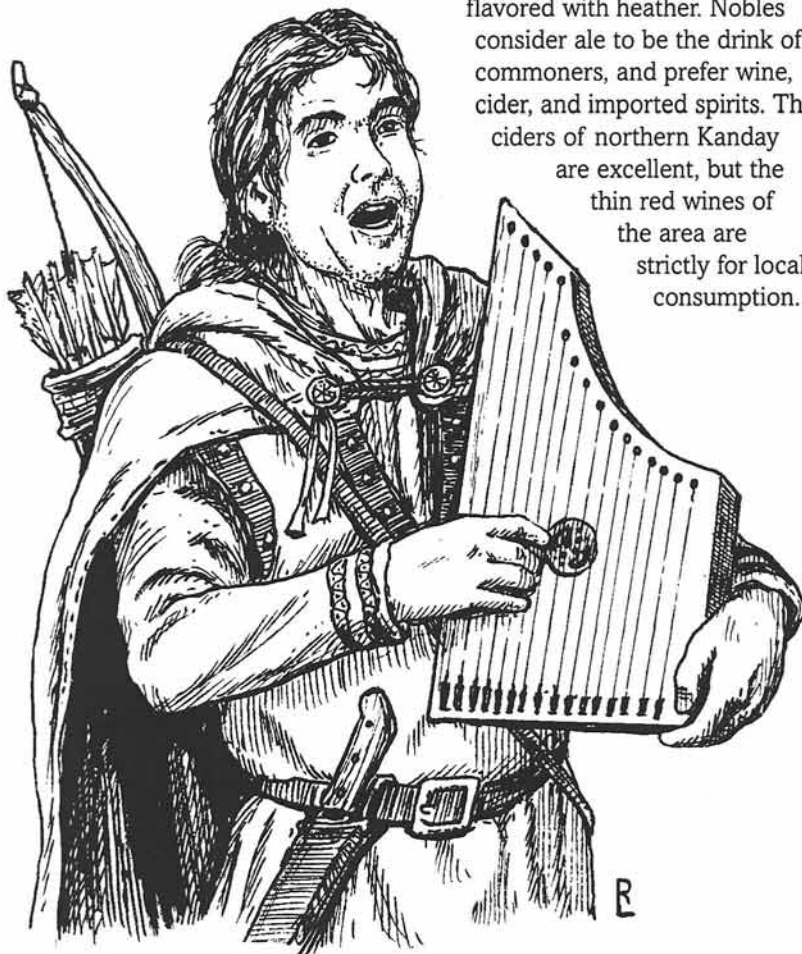
Kandian cuisine is determined by its agriculture and fisheries, with strong influences from the Laranian and Peonian churches. Peasants subsist on coarse rye bread and a barley pottage or unseasoned soup of beans and cabbage. Mutton is rarely added, especially in the south, and local Peonianism is strongly vegetarian.

Seaside villages enrich their diets with fish, shellfish, and shorebirds. Fishing in rivers is controlled, but not forbidden.

Nobles consume large quantities of mutton and beef. In sharp contrast with their northern neighbors, pork and ham are considered socially unacceptable.

With the exception of Sarkum, fish is not considered suitable for the diet of a warrior. There are strict laws against the sale or consumption of horse and dog meat. Most noble households are regular consumers of imported spices and wines, which are used liberally when entertaining.

Ewes are valued for their milk. Most Kandian salters produce two sheep's milk cheeses, a delicate semisoft Biangueret and a hard aromatic Bianguen. Salters in coastal settlements pack hundreds of pounds of salt cod annually. Herring and eels pickled in sweetened vinegar are popular at fairs and markets throughout the kingdom. Most inns and taverns brew a mild pale ale and a dry rye ale flavored with heather. Nobles consider ale to be the drink of commoners, and prefer wine, cider, and imported spirits. The ciders of northern Kanday are excellent, but the thin red wines of the area are strictly for local consumption.

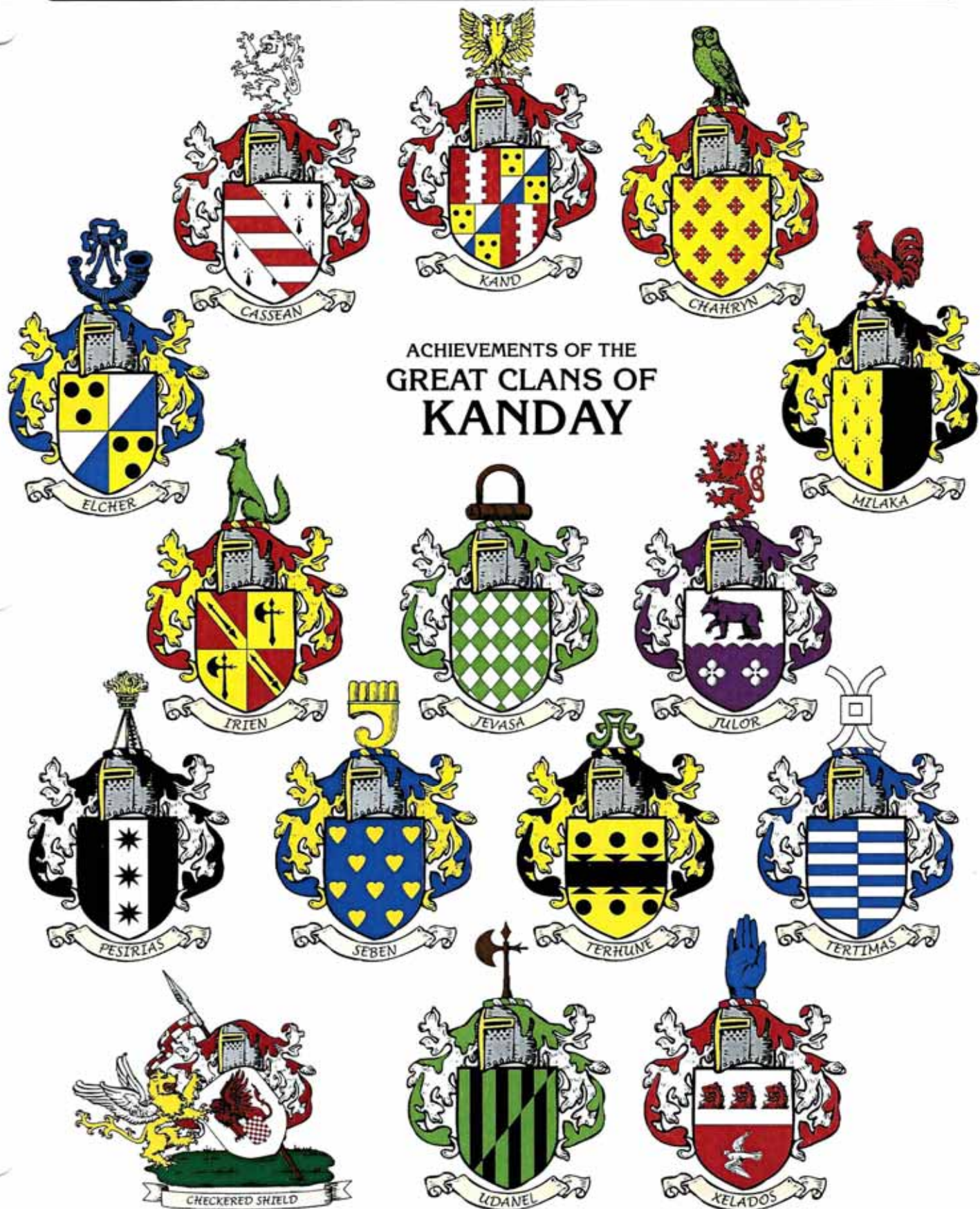


Music

Kandian music has been beneficially influenced by the excellent Harpers' Hall in Aleath. Instruments of all kinds can be found in Kanday, although string instruments are the most popular.

Woodwinds are common among the lower classes. Brass horns suffer from their association with Agrikanism.

The Laranian church favors polyphonic chants and harmonies with bowed stringed instruments of different sizes, sometimes accompanied by a singer. Courtly music is influenced by the church but is less restrictive, allowing multiple accompanists of both sexes and the use of large harps. Drums produce sounds far too coarse for the ears of ladies.

ROYAL GOVERNMENT

The feudal structure in Kanday has evolved from the remnants of the old Corani patrician class and the annexation of numerous petty kingdoms. The royal government of Kanday is an extension of the royal household, and many of its officers travel with the king. The monarch appoints all senior (and several minor) members of the bureaucracy. The department heads choose most of their subordinates. Sheriffs are the king's agents within their shires. They are answerable to the Exchequer for financial matters and to the Chancellor for judicial matters. Each sheriff holds a royal stronghold for the king.

The table below outlines the structure of the government in Kanday. Offices and monthly salaries are shown with the current holders of major offices listed in *italics*.

The Chamber			
The Chamberlain, Sir Aldren Garawe, is responsible for the operation of the royal household. He has daily access to the king which makes him one of the most influential men in the realm.			
The Chancery			
The Chancellor oversees the judiciary of the kingdom. He appoints various legal officials and presides over the chancery court. The office is currently held by Sir Cerale Lamin, a Save-K'norran priest.			
The Exchequer			
The Chancellor of the Exchequer is the chief financial officer. He collects royal revenues (through the sheriffs) and advises the king on budgetary matters. The Chancellor of the Exchequer is Sir Marik Hunvele.

SHIRES AND HUNDREDS

Kanday is divided into seven shires, each sub-divided into hundreds. These judicial divisions are unrelated to the feudal subinfeudation of land.

Each shire is administered by a sheriff (shire-reeve). The sheriff's seat (shire moot) is shown below each shire name.

The sheriff appoints a bailiff to administer local justice in each hundred. The hundred moot is shown.

The main settlement in each hundred is given under Market. Forest hundreds are largely unpopulated. See the next page for details.

FOREST HUNDREDS

Kanday's unpopulated regions are administered by forest wardens with assistance from paid royal foresters. The wardens are charged with protecting and exploiting resources for the benefit of the crown. Although forest wardens are answerable to the sheriff, in practice they are the sole arbiters of law and order within their hundreds. Poachers may be captured and bound over to the sheriff for justice, but it is not uncommon for a forest warden to resolve the issue directly.

Aleur Hundred

The southern shore of Daenshire forms the foggy Aleur Hundred. Dense cedar and holly forest along the shore is made nearly impenetrable by thick tangles of deadfall and thorny brier. The settlements along the river near Aleath are primarily support for the defensive watchtowers. The Timberwrights' and Charcoalers' Guilds work in the oak-hickory forests along the riverbanks near Aleath, but seldom venture into the white pine forest beyond where the Gozyda roam. The settlements in Aleur Hundred are held from Sumon, Kedis, and the Peonian Church.

Arguer Hundred

Arguer Hundred is a region of isolated wetlands, grasslands, and mixed oak-hickory woodland rich in deer and gamebirds. The forest warden is the Serolan of the remote and beautiful Harchesa Abbey. The abbey is a site for study and the consecration of religious items. The secret prison and interrogation chambers of the *Checked Shield* are here. Unauthorized persons in the hundred are harshly treated.

Elos Hundred

Elos Hundred extends from Cape Saurol and the southern Eryne Hills to the confluence of the Tepr and the Eryn Rivers. The north bank of the Tepr River at the edge of the Tepr Bog is home to a pair of eccentric Ilviran hermits. They are sometimes visited by folk seeking wisdom, but for most of the year they have a lonely existence.

Helous Hundred

Helous Hundred is rough hill-country dominated by the rugged northern Eryne Hills. The forest warden is a violent brute and his henchmen are eager to dispense "outland justice" at any opportunity. Prince Anaflas, the Sheriff of Perishire, is considering replacing him, forcibly if necessary.

Lakane Hundred

Lakane Hundred covers the southern tip of Selionshire. Most of it is covered by Rohmae Moor, a cold, windy expanse of heather and pitch pine. The rocky shore is littered with the bleaching bones of seamen and remains of ships driven ashore by the fierce local winds.

Mimean Hundred

The deep and forbidding Mimea Forest is within the range of the Mimeyi sub-tribe of the Gozyda who struggle against the warlike Tulwyn to the east, civilized Kanday to the west, and Tharda to the north. Several bands of half-breeds and outlaws have established themselves in this hundred.

Mineous Forest

The pine forest of Mineous has long been the home of Clan Murel, descendants of a legendary half-breed Gozyda chieftain who assisted the Kands to survive during the Theocracy. Sir Dirithon Murel, Lord of Murelno, is the current forest warden and a generous patron of the Charcoalers' Guild. The clan has close familial ties with the Gozyda and often act as intermediaries.

Raden Hundred

Raden Hundred is a rugged area, dotted with caves and rocky outcroppings, favored by prospectors of the Miners' Guild for its ores and gemstones. Ivashu sightings are often reported. The forest warden and his men seldom venture far off the Selion Trail between Avertu and Chison.

Tamsen Hundred

Tamsen is a coastal heath from Hebon north to Kirque Bay and east to the headwaters of the Tepr River. It includes the treacherous Tepr Bog, the windswept Merelin Hills, and the extensive saltmarshes of Vashel, home to thousands of seabirds. Rumors persist of a treasure secreted in the saltmarsh by King Purl of Rethem, who died assaulting Sarkum.

Tesien Hundred

Tesien Moor is the site of Feniryn, the abandoned "city" of Workol the Astrologer, a mystic of the Corani Empire. It shelters a band of brigands led by the mysterious Erewan of the Moor. The brigands rob travelers along the lonely trails from Dunir to Menekod and Selvos. Trade is light and usually well-guarded.

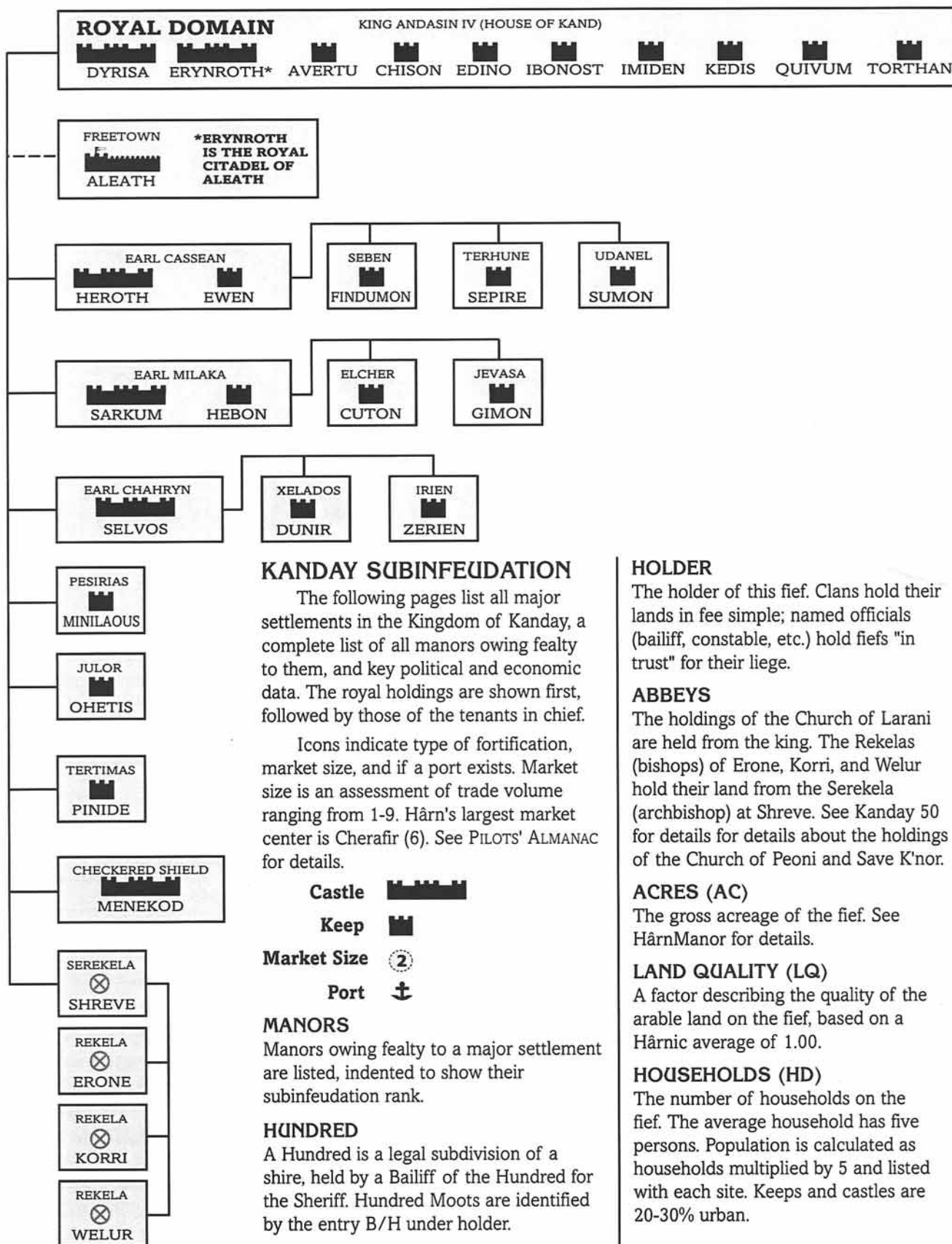

*Aleath is the site of *Caer Erynroth*. The castle does not hold any manors and provides no feudal levy. It is maintained by taxes from the freeholders of Aleath.

MILITARY GARRISONS

Knight-Equivalents (Medium Horse) owed to the crown is derived from total acres ÷ 1200. This figure can easily be adjusted to Heavy Horse (1500 acres) and Men-at-Arms (300 acres). Fiefs can also muster a militia force roughly equal to the number of households for defense only. Major settlements also have a permanent garrison attached to the keep or castle; assume one company (20 men) per keep, and two companies (40 men) per castle.

The two permanent armed forces in Kanday are the Royal Guard and the *Order of the Checkered Shield*. The king obtains military forces from the feudal levy and mercenaries. Organization of armies in the field is flexible. In time of war a noble is named Lord Marshal to command the forces. The Royal Guard is an elite force responsible for the protection of the royal household. It is composed of two squadrons of knights and three companies of men at arms. Some of the Royal Guard travel with the king, but forces are sometimes away for special duties.

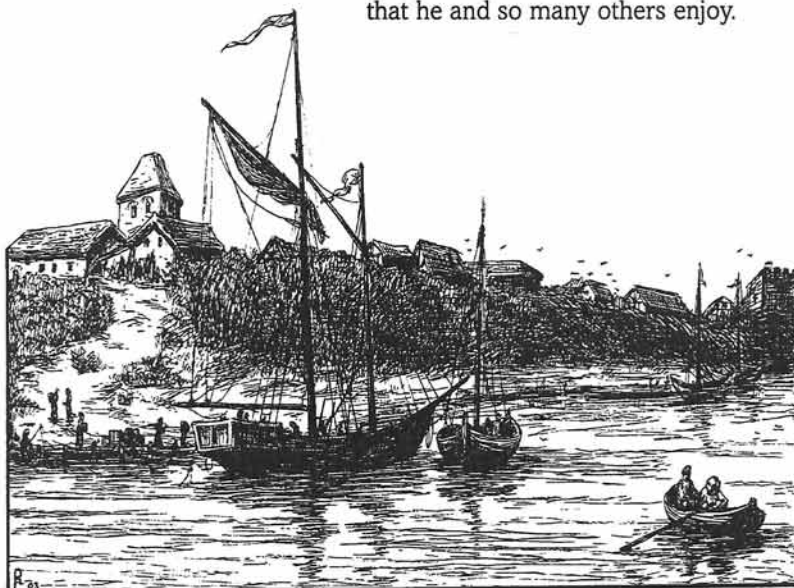
Aleta Hundred, Erynashire, 5800

Aleath is a chartered freetown, governed by a council of a mayor and twelve aldermen proposed by the Mangai and appointed by the king. Military authority is shared by the royal constable of **Caer Erynroth** and the Sheriff of Eryna (see **KEDIS**). There is also a town militia that is theoretically commanded by the mayor, but the custom has been for the mayor to surrender this authority to the constable. There are no manors owing to Aleath, but the city charter includes 8000 acres of cropland, a legacy of the old Republic of Aleath. This land is farmed by approximately 140 freeholders who pay taxes to the city.

The fair freetown of Aleath is the cultural center of Kanday. The *Violet Mantle Palace of Arms* is the best equipped and best managed college of heralds in western Hârn. The *Palace of the Masks* is a highly-regarded center of drama and satire and home to one of the finest companies of thespians in all of Hârn. The College of Harpers, the largest on Hârn, boasts extensive collections of written music and rare instruments.

Aleath is also the thriving commercial heart of the kingdom. Wool cloth, grain, preserved foods, and other goods produced in local surplus find a market here with seagoing mercantylers bound for Cherafir and beyond. In the five years since the start of the courtship of Prince Jevan Toron and Princess Eriel, most goods from Melderyn (including all Lythian goods from the Larun of Cherafir) come into western Hârn through the port here. The increased trade has bolstered Aleathean prosperity and mercantile skill.

Mayor Gurin of Pomada is an honorable, hard-working and effective administrator. He is a progressive man who tries to ensure the poor of Aleath are not forgotten in the prosperity that he and so many others enjoy.



CAER ERYNROTH

The royal citadel of Aleath was constructed between 633-45 by Andasin II as part of the agreement that made Aleath a freetown.

Constable Sir Denil Chahryn is charged with the defense of Aleath and the administration of the crown's extensive local interests. **Caer Erynroth's** garrison patrols the city and castle walls, leaving the streets to the mayor's policing forces.

Caer Erynroth is home to an elite company of veteran medium foot, a company of equally experienced archers, plus a score of servants. The latter are burdened by a number of lesser bureaucrats and dissolute hangers-on who fill their hours with petty political sniping and schemes to improve their fortunes.

Sir Denil Chahryn is the grand-nephew of Sir Grolis Chahryn, Earl of Selvos and lord of all of northwestern Kanday. With the help of the unscrupulous mercantyleer Damaen of Hilome, Sir Denil has grown wealthy importing the drug Fanosel for the recreational use of the more dissipated of the courtiers and a veteran manus of archers. The servants know that the king would dismiss Sir Denil if the scandal ever reached his ears, but they are afraid of Sir Denil and his warriors. Sir Denil knows this as well; he has never used the drug himself. Much of his personal wealth is in gold and silver jewelry hidden here and the balance is cached in an oaken chest buried near Selvos.

The constable's fiscal reputation is excellent. His payments to the royal treasury are always on time and usually exceed the demand. Sir Denil personally owns a 40 percent stake in the *Geldara's Butterfly*, a coastal nivic owned by mercantyleer/usurer Damaen of Hilome.

Sir Denil is a strutting peacock who takes every opportunity to be the center of attention. He hosts monthly events for local nobility, and stays in close contact with the Mangai as well.

AVERTU [E9] **Asolena Hundred, Selionshire, 530**

Avertu is the seat of the Sheriff of Selionshire, whose charge is mostly a wind-swept heath of low fertility and sparse population. The keep is austere, as are the lives of the deeply religious fishermen and shepherds who scratch out a living here. Avertu produces salt cod, and wool in sufficient quantities to supply weavers and dyers of Urienshire and Erynashire. Additional income is generated by the many valuable herbs to be found on the moors. The dangers involved limit the number of folk willing to gather them.

The keep is relatively modern, being built in 509 as a naval base of the Corani Empire. It prospered as one of the few safe anchorages on the southern coast. The region had earlier been settled by Jarin, but they found the land ill-suited to farming and subsisted mainly from fishing. With the collapse of the empire, Avertu lapsed again into relative obscurity until the unification of Kanday following Ezar's War.

Sheriff Jens Demilaen, appointed by Queen Mirelael, is distressed by the growing power of the Earl of Sarkum and his influence over Andasin IV. Sir Jens regards himself as the greatest loyalist of the House of Kand, but feels the present king is something of a disappointment. He wisely keeps his doubts to himself.

Sir Jens' loyal service has been rewarded by royal appointments for his kin. The Inquisitor General is his sister-in-law and her husband, Sir Bruncon, is the much-feared Collector General. These close connections to the royal government provide Sir Jens with greater influence than most sheriffs.

The sheriff is a devout supporter of the church. Inspired by the massive cathedral being built at KORRI, Sir Jens dreams of founding a Temple to Larani in Avertu. The immense cost of such an undertaking far exceeds his own wealth, but he stubbornly promotes the idea with any visitor of substance. He gets little encouragement from the clerics of nearby Chendy Abbey who currently receive most Laranian tithes in the region.

CHISON [E8] **Chisona Hundred, Urienshire, 480**

Chison is the wealthy market town of Urienshire, a rural center of weaving and dying for export to Aleath and beyond. It is lonely sheep country, and shepherds are well known for fanciful tales of things seen in the morning mists, or spirits heard in the distance.

The original keep was built in 382 on the site of an old Aletan tribal fort. A small barrow grave cemetery lies about a mile north of the settlement. During the Theocracy of Tekhos a bizarre Morgathian cult operated from a hidden temple in the area. A small chantry of the Guild of Arcane Lore at Woben Manor is dedicated to uncovering the secrets of the vanished Morgathians. The famed Laranian exorcist, Marena Lunteyn, leads the search. They have located what they believe to be the sealed entrance to an underground crypt and plan to excavate as soon as possible.

The Sheriff of Urien, Sir Nordis Lunteyn, is thirty-two. He is a talented harper and something of a romantic. The annual wool fair in Chison is well-attended by the leading harpers and thespians of Kanday.

Sir Nordis believes in the ideals of knighthood. One of his fondest desires is the establishment of a regular tournament of chivalry similar to the great Chelebin tourney held annually in Olokand, Kaldor. Sir Nordis is not known for his jousting ability but is a skilled rider and horse-trainer. Since his appointment in 717, he has thrice petitioned Andasin IV to sponsor a royal tourney. The king is thus far disinterested and Sir Nordis is considering seeking the support of Prince Anaflas.

Chakre Hundred, Torensire, 385



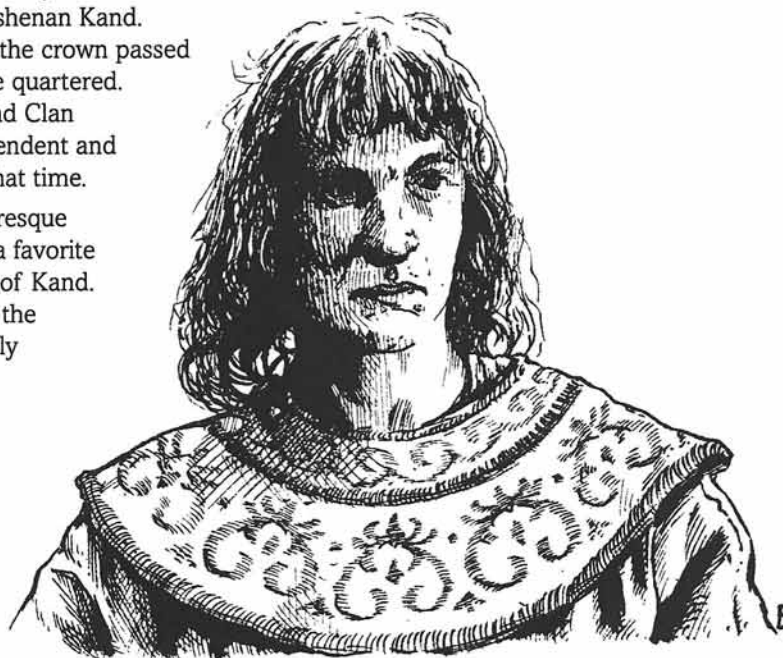
Originally built in 364 by King Alash of Aleathia, the keep was seized by Korlim Elcher following the collapse of the Theocracy in 588. He established an independent state which eventually allied with the second Republic of Aleath, and was annexed by the growing kingdom of Kanday. The fourth baron was Korlim's granddaughter Arelora, who married Ashenan, and became the first

queen of Kanday after his death. After her death the barony reverted to her second cousin. In 693 Eriel made the Baron of Cuton a vassal of the Earl of Sarkum.

The present baron is Rykkan Elcher. Rykkan is twenty-six and a close friend of Prince Anafas, the king's younger brother.

Clan Elcher and the House of Kand were united by marriage in 639 when the wealthy Baroness Arelora Elcher wed Prince Ashenan Kand. Upon the death of Ashenan, the crown passed to Arelora and the arms were quartered. Arelora died without issue and Clan Elcher has pursued an independent and prosperous existence since that time.

Cuton, a quiet and picturesque fishing settlement, has been a favorite seaside retreat of the House of Kand. The fishermen of Cuton and the surrounding villages are highly skilled and sought-after as seamen on the wharves of Aleath.

DUNIR [D8] ①

Sheda Hundred, Perishire, 405



The first fortification at Dunir was built by Xuaka of Aleathia in 437. Following the annexation of Aleathia by the Corani Empire, Dunir became a legion fortress and minor naval base.

During the Interregnum, Dunir was an independent state and eventually an ally of Kanday. In 654 Dunir, surrendered to King Arlun of Rethem, who had taken

advantage of the death of Andasin II to occupy the area. In 681, King Nemiran of Rethem granted Dunir to the Agrikan Order of the Copper Hook. The keep was besieged by the Kandians during Ezar's War, and fell in 693.

The commander of the victorious force, Sir Yuri Xelados, was raised to baron in 695 and made a vassal of the Earl of Selvos. Yuri is now sixty three, and although he is troubled by gout, he has lost none of his youthful enthusiasm for hunting, drinking, and lechery.

Dunir is busier than its outlying location would suggest. The only safe road from Selvos to Menekod passes through Dunir (the shorter route is blocked by Hyen Keep). Dunir benefits from the traffic between these important castles.

Land quality at Dunir is below average. The damp climate and extensive heath uplands are better-suited for sheep. Good income is generated from the sea. Dunir is also known for its warhorses which often sell for sums in excess of £10.

The Elos Trail is a wilderness track from Dyrisa. This was the fabled trail used by Elos, and the route of Queen Eriel's army during Ezar's War. The path is rugged and travelers can easily lose their way. Wheeled traffic cannot cope with the many dips and bends. Log bridges spanning creeks and ravines were erected by Eriel's army but most have fallen into disrepair.

Dunir is a common starting point for expeditions to the mysterious Place of Bones on desolate Tesien Moor.

DYRISA [E8]

Kandis Hundred, Daenshire, 2300



After Aleath, Dyrisa is the second largest settlement in Kanday. It is a dominated by an impressive castle. Located at the head of navigation on the River Eryn, the fortress guards a good stone bridge bearing the Aleath-Coranan Road. The city wall was begun in 718 and is still under construction. Dyrisa prospers as a major outlet for the wool cloth produced by the Laranian abbeys at Shreve and Erone. Dyrisa also boasts a magnificent Laranian cathedral, begun in 669 and finished in 715.

Dyrisa was built by the Corani Empire in 388 on the site of an earlier fortification and tribal settlement. From 569-620 Dyrisa was held by a series of Morgathian despots. In 620 it surrendered to Andasin I after a bitter siege. The Morgathian temple which stood at the center of the town was immediately razed. Dyrisa has since been the principal seat of the kings of Kanday.

The king spends at least four months of each year in Dyrisa, mostly during the winter. The Constable of Dyrisa, Sir Fodin Dravaen, governs when the king is absent. He is gruff man with a violent past. Sir Fodin was knighted by Queen Eriel for bravery at the Battle of Hebon Keep where he was wounded while defending the fallen king's body. Previously, Sir Fodin fought in the Treasure War for Kaldor and later led a mercenary company near Geda. He fled charges of manslaughter following a tavern brawl and was declared outlaw. He made his way west to Kanday seeking service in the king's army. Sir Fodin holds nearby Ibin Manor, also granted by Queen Eriel.

EDINO [E8] ①

Dunzael Hundred, Daenshire, 370

Edino was built in 403 by Queen Elana of Aleathia. Following the annexation of that kingdom by the Corani Empire, the keep became the residence of one of the deputy governors of Aleathia province. Edino is most famous as the birthplace of Andasin I, the founder of Kanday, whose father was executed by the Morgathians. In 598 Andasin attacked Edino and seized it from the vicious warlord Taklar Zedabas, "The Ogre". Edino is now the moot of Daenshire.

Edino was the home of Eladas of Kand, who built and supported the secret army used by Andasin I to overthrow the Theocracy and liberate Aleathia. Its long history of tragedy and triumph is known to all its residents, and stirring tales of heroism are common fare in local inns. Edino is linked to the eastern part of Daenshire by a ferry. This is a defensive measure; an ancient bridge was destroyed and never rebuilt.

The Sheriff of Daen is Sir Crasel Avandar, a hardworking and laconic man of forty eight. Sir Crasel was a model of Laranian chivalry in his youth, distinguishing himself at Dunir and Selvos, and again in the disastrous Kuseme War. The garrison at Edino, an elite force of veteran medium horse, has served under him since 714.

EWEN [E7] ■ ① ⚓**Ravin Hundred, Noreashire, 405**

Ewen is a busy port on the Thard River and one of the most productive grain centers of Kanday. The surrounding fertile fields have been fought over for generations. The people are deeply religious, unforgiving, and intolerant of outsiders. The keep and its garrison are in a constant state of readiness.

Ewen was built by the Corani Empire in 386 to complement the fortification at Tehen. The town and district were decimated during "Sanguine Azura", a month-long orgy of execution in 557 during the purges of Medak, the last Corani Emperor. An annual local festival "celebrates" this terror with a fest on Azura 8 during which a mannequin, or an unfortunate live captive, is dressed in the robes of an Agrikan priest and burned atop a bonfire.

Throughout the Interregnum, Ewen was the center of the Kingdom of Ravin, which was governed by the brigand "clan" Soursi. The Laranian *Order of the Checkered Shield* captured Ewen in 623, and the keep has been one of the fiefs of the Earl of Heroth since that title was created.

The present constable is Sir Willem Tast, a distant cousin of Earl Cassean. He is a vengeful zealot, known to torture and execute Agrikan captives without mercy. All crimes are prosecuted vigorously and not always justly.

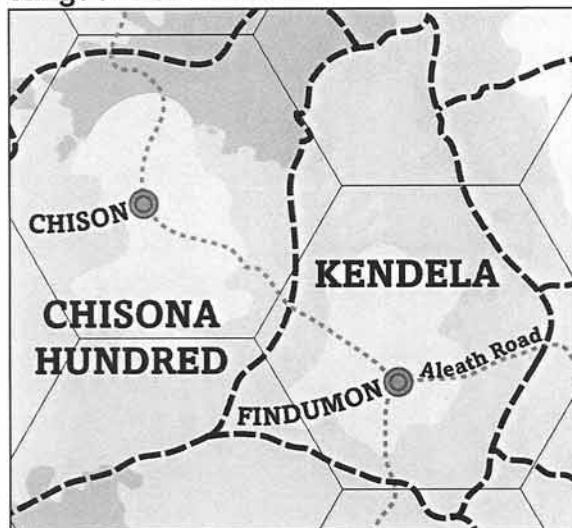
Findumon was built by King Alash of Aleathia in 365. During the Interregnum, Findumon was the capital of the petty kingdom of Kendela ruled by clan Seben. In 689 Nasla Seben swore fealty to Andasin III and was made a vassal of the Earl of Heroth.

Daffyd Seben, Nasla's son, is thirty eight and suffering from the early stages of a wasting disease.

Findumon is home of the Kandian Longhair, the gentle, long-lived, and high-yielding sheep on which much of Kanday's economy is based. Sir Daffyd's father Nasla founded Pindela, a village held by a chantry of the Guild of Arcane Lore, dedicated to the study of sheep and wool production. Sir Daffyd supports the chantry generously and visits with his sister, the Pelnala of Chantaer Abbey, every spring to share ideas and knowledge.

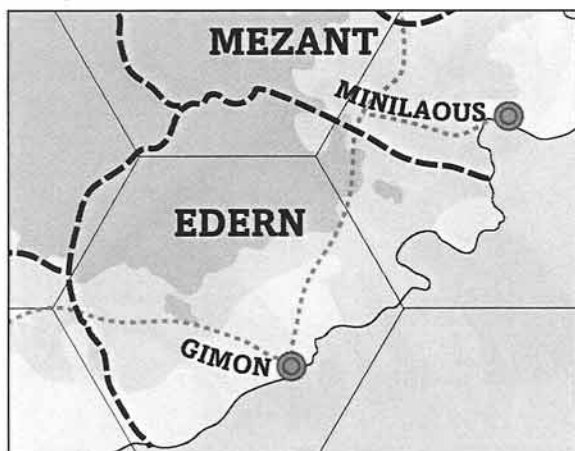
GIMON [E9] **Gimonae Hundred, Selionshire, 320**

Gimon, a struggling fishing port, is home to a rough crowd of fishermen and lead miners. The area was especially hard hit by a storm two years ago, and visible signs of the damage remain in the battered piers and recently-repaired buildings.

Nearby Nadur and Yindaen are dominated by a secretive cult to Eder, the membership of which includes the bailiff of Yindaen manor.

Gimon was built in 426 by King Chernae of Aleathia as a present for one of his most trusted advisors. In 621 it became the capital of the small kingdom of Edern ruled by clan Daltene. In 689 Rogryn Daltene reluctantly swore fealty to Andasin III. When Rogryn died in 711 leaving no acceptable heir, the barony lapsed for five years.

In 716 Andasin IV granted the title to Tobrin Jevasa and made the fief subject to the Earl of Sarkum. Tobrin is fifty-two and a free-thinker. He is a keen strategist and has been a close advisor of the earl for many years.

Andur Hundred, Selionshire, 190

One of the most remote settlements on Hârn, Hebon has not recovered from the devastation caused by Ezar's War a generation ago.

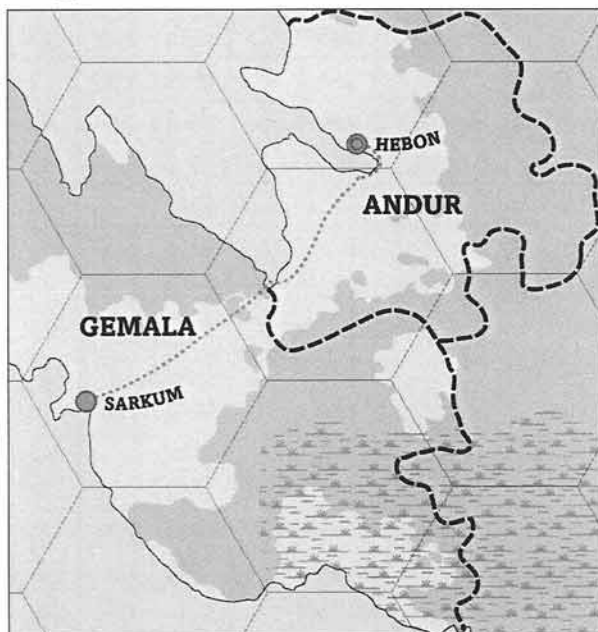
Hebon is blessed with two productive iron mines, a quarry and a salt pan. Hebon would do a brisk trade in sealskins and salt cod, but the prevailing westerly winds make sea trade difficult, and the brigands to the east make overland travel too risky to be profitable. Sir Elander Avandar, newly-appointed Warden of Raden Forest (and nephew of the Sheriff of Daen) is seeking able-bodied men to help patrol the route and bring the brigand leaders to justice.

The keep was built by Xuaka in 433 and made an Imperial naval base in 524. In 602 Hebon became the center of the kingdom of Andur, ruled by clan Belle. It fell to Rethemi armies during Ezar's War in 688 when most of the ruling clan were slain. In 690, Andasin III lost his life recapturing the keep. According to local legend, his ghost is said to appear on irregular occasions.

Constable Sovril Milaka, the Earl of Sarkum's younger brother, is a petty tyrant. He maintains large stores of preserved food and weapons as a safeguard against invasion. The constable reacts harshly toward those who trouble him with repeated sightings of Andasin's ghost.

Narath Hundred, Noreashire, 570



Heroth controls a major commercial and military crossroads. It is the market center of one of the richest agricultural areas in western Hårn and a tempting target for expansion by Marshal Kronas of Tharda. If not for the cost of defense, the earl would be a far wealthier man.

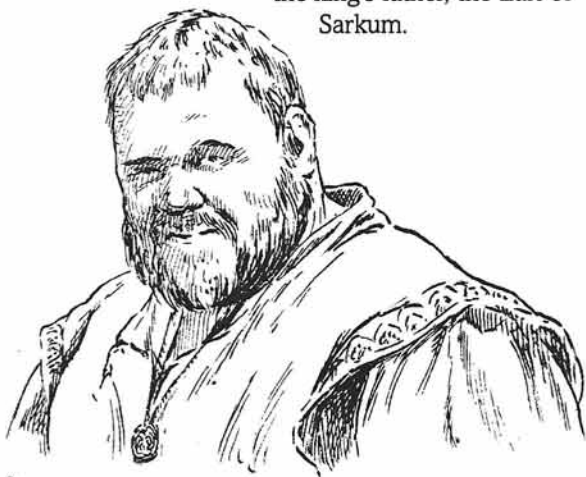
The dense Ravenath Forest enables the Timberwrights' and Charcoalers' guilds to contribute significantly to

the local economy. The forest is also a prominent source of yew for longbows, and an infamous refuge for outlaws.

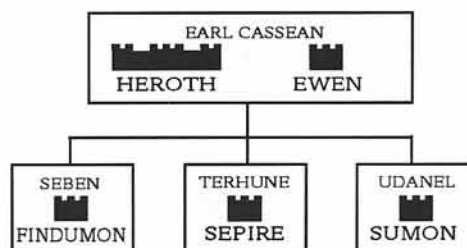
The castle was originally built as a Corani Empire fortress in 421. Its seizure by Xuaka of Aleathia in 443 sparked the war between the two states that resulted in the annexation of Aleathia by the Empire.

Following the collapse of the Theocracy, Heroth was ruled by a series of violent despots who styled themselves lords of Norea. In 623 it was captured by the *Order of the Checkered Shield*. The earldom was created by Andasin II in 647.

Earl Cassean, an ambitious aristocrat in his late forties, is currently attempting to marry his daughter to the king, an event which is not viewed favorably by the king's father, the Earl of Sarkum.

IBONOST [F7] **Teba Hundred, Daenshire, 385**

Ibonost is a picturesque port on the Teb River, easily reachable from Moleryn, but a long and difficult trek from the rest of Kanday. Militarily a burden and economically only barely viable, it admirably fulfills its purpose as a drain on the purses of ambitious courtiers. The trade in lead and forest products finds its natural outlet in Moleryn and the Thardic Republic, but it is often disrupted by political strife; few mercantylers consider Ibonost a choice location for a franchise. Others would prefer to see the town annexed by the republic under which they feel their commercial interests would be better served.

Founded by the Corani Empire in 497, Ibonost was the first major settlement taken by Andasin I in 589. In 663, during the Five Year War, the *Battle of the Teb Marshes* fought seven leagues east of Ibonost ended in Kandian defeat and the loss of the keep to the Thardic League. The Treaty of Quivum in 666 returned Ibonost to Kanday.

Ibonost has considerable sentimental meaning to the House of Kand and, despite its proximity to the Thardic Republic, remains a favorite summer residence of Andasin IV.

The constable is Sir Burdas Kandry, a distant relative of the king. He holds three nearby manors, Clerdy, Pymint, and Stymon in his own name. Sir Burdas spends considerable time and income improving his Clerdy fief.

Three ruined manors exist along the east bank of the Teb. They were abandoned nearly sixty years ago during the Five Year War and now lie within the Thardic Republic. Plans to build a Ramala Legion fort at Dunikar have often been proposed, but still await approval. This would be provocative to King Andasin.

Nearby Venric Abbey is renowned for its potent brandy with a distinctive taste of honey, brambles, and peat, which the locals call *Black Dragon*. The abbey also has a reputation for teaching martial skills. Ashesa and Matakea from Venric are usually capable warriors.

The *Order of the Checkered Shield* maintain a nearby chapter house at Lebenil. Duty here is popular since the hunting, fishing, and brandy are always excellent.

Imiden Keep was built in 477 as a Corani legion fortress. In 624 its brigand holders surrendered to the *Checkered Shield*. Imiden was the main target of the attack that began Ezar's War in 682.

The Sheriff of Peris is Prince Anaflas Milaka, younger brother of the king, and a capable, energetic administrator.

Prince Anaflas is heir to his father's title (Earl of Sarkum) and also to the throne since Andasin IV has yet to take a wife. Several lords of the realm wish Prince Anaflas ruled in place of his elder brother, who is perceived as weak.

Imiden presents a major threat to Rethemi forces at Omnis and in Golotha beyond. The military forces are in a constant state of readiness, and much of the area's considerable natural wealth is consumed by the scores of knights and horses that patrol the Urmore and Timrola hundreds.

Prince Anaflas and the *Order of the Checkered Shield* are considered by most locals as the primary defense against the horrors of the Agrikans and the Morgathians. Northern Kandians are highly intolerant of the dark churches.

*Waldel is a chapter house held by a Reblena of the Checkered Shield who serves as Bailiff of the Hundred.

KEDIS [E7] 1**Kedisa Hundred, Erynashire, 375**

Kedis is the administrative center of the densely populated and wealthy Kedisa Hundred. Most overland trade to Aleath from the north passes through Kedis. The thriving local economy is based upon highly-skilled local fullers, weavers, and dyers, and upon the innkeepers, teamsters, cartwrights, and other skilled craftsmen that keep trade moving to Pinide, Dyrisa, and beyond.

Kedis was built in 368 to guard the northern approach to Aleath. The keep was rebuilt during the Corani Empire.

The Sheriff of Eryna is Earl Ranald Milaka of Sarkum. The earl finds Kedis to be conveniently close to the centers of power and he spends considerable time here, in part to keep watch over the constable. The office of Bailiff of Aleta Hundred is currently vacant. Important legal matters are handled directly by the sheriff, who is eager to appoint a B/H.

In stark contrast to his brother, the Rekela of Ternula, constable Elaris Milaka is a scheming wastrel with grand plans that far outreach his ability. He is, however, one of the most lethal swordsmen in the Eryna Valley. This and his kinship to the royal family enable him to hold a position for which he is eminently unsuited.

MENEKOD [E7] ①

Damorane Hundred, Perishire, 750



Founded during the Corani Empire, Arlun of Rethem seized Menekod in 653 and began constructing a castle. In 681 King Nemiran granted it to the *Order of the Copper Hook*, and it became their

primary seat. In 695 Menekod was taken by Kanday in the last major clash of Ezar's War. Mirelael granted the castle to the *Order of the Checkered Shield*.

Menekod controls the road to Heroth, Dyrisa, and all of Kanday. It is a constant threat to southern Rethem. The knights of the order continually patrol the region. Most folk consider the *Checkered Shield* their sole defense against the return of the Theocracy. There is, however, a price to be paid: people are arrested on the slightest suspicion and detained indefinitely at their own expense. Laranian fanaticism permeates all social and commercial activity, making it difficult for Haleans and others to operate profitably.

The present Chabla (Grandmaster) is Sir Syman Telfane. There is a dispute between him and the Sheriff of Norea at Quivum regarding control of Dovan, among other things. Sir Syman's father, Sir Boromis Telfane, is the Serolan Royal.

MINILAOUS [E9] 1

Mezant Hundred, Torensire, 390



The keep was built in 421 on the site of an old Aletan tribal settlement. After the Theocracy collapsed, Minilaous was ruled as the independent kingdom of Mezant by clan Pesirias. The founder of the clan claimed descent from both Aleathian and Corani nobility, although there is considerable doubt as to the veracity of this. In 689 Larryn Pesirias swore fealty to Andasin III.

The present baron, Larryn's grandniece Iala, is a sharp-witted woman of thirty. She is presently unmarried; her two previous husbands are deceased.

Mirwyn Hundred, Daenshire, 435



Built in 621, King Ashenan created the barony in 655, granting it to Vordi Julor. In 669 Vordi was raised to Earl of Kuseme as a reward for his actions during the Five Year War. In 712 Vordi's impulsive grandson Ernald involved Kanday in the Kuseme War, and lost most of his lands.

Sir Ernald still privately styles himself Earl of Kuseme.

Although the title is officially lapsed, he is constantly plotting schemes to regain his lost lands. The baron is unpopular at court and is given to foolish and arrogant pride. His gambling has left him heavily in debt to Eryck of Graek, a mercantylor in Dyrisa.

Ohetis is comfortable sheep country where little happens of any note. The gentle slopes and flat fields support huge flocks of sheep.

The mysterious and foreboding Douwa Downs, a rugged maze of ravines with tortured vegetation and foul fogs, lie east of Ohetis. Along the northeast shore of Lake Mora are a cluster of hot pools known as Balek. The ruins of an Agrikan temple from the Corani Empire exist at the springs. The few hardy folk from Ohetis who venture into Douwa Downs steer well clear of the ruins, fearing its evil reputation.

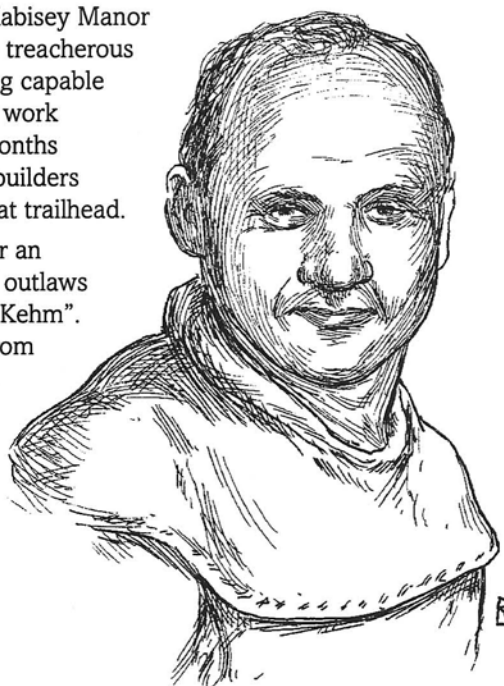
PINIDE [E8] 1**Omele Hundred, Urienshire, 390**

Pinide was built in 424 as a royal residence by the dissolute King Chernae of Aleathia. In 629 Ottan Tertimas became one of the first petty rulers in the Eryn valley to swear fealty to Andasin II. Clan Tertimas have traditionally been strong supporters of the House of Kand. It is sometimes said that "When the King's dog growls the Barons of Pinide bark".

The present baron is Sir Stennis Tertimas, a fleshy fifty-one year old, whose bluff manner masks a sophisticated mind. Sir Stennis is an accomplished Savoryan. He maintains his contacts in Melderyn through his sister Marimena Dargever.

Pinide is a critical center of the wool trade, through which passes much of the produce of Sepire and Dyrisa. To gain better access to Chison and the southwest, and to enable better patrols southward, Sir Stennis is attempting to forge a road from Kabisey Manor through Kehm Moor. The moor is treacherous and the baron has difficulty finding capable workers to finish the work. When work is underway, usually during the months of Kelen, Nulus, and Larane, the builders maintain a fortified encampment at trailhead.

Kehm Moor is a sanctuary for an especially-well organized gang of outlaws known locally as "The Wolves of Kehm". These ruthless cutthroats come from all parts of Southeastern Kanday, banished from their homes and most with bounties on the heads. The outlaws are not, of course, supporters of the baron's road project, and do their best to discourage it by harassing and robbing the builders.

QUIVUM [E7] ①

Yedarn Hundred, Noreashire, 295

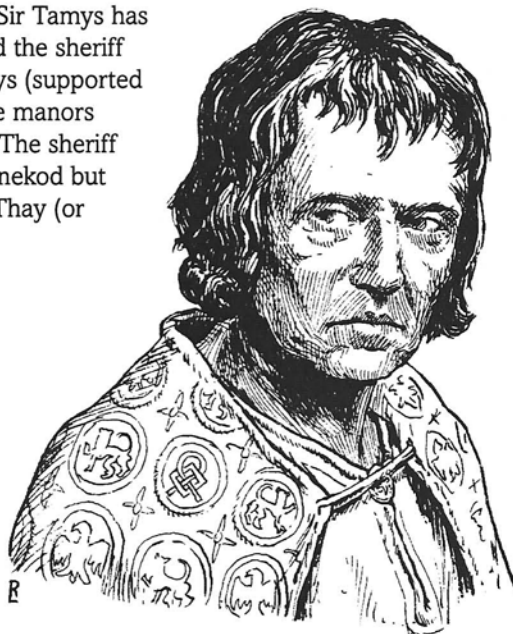
Quivum, the bustling gateway to Coranan, the Salt Route, and all of eastern Hårn, is a tense, dynamic place, full of exciting stories and opportunities for adventure. The densely populated area is a tinderbox; the provincial Laranian fanaticism of the nobles and the peasantry does not combine easily with the liberal views espoused by the mercantylers and craftsmen of the burgeoning guilded class.

Built by the Corani Empire in 448 to ensure that the provisions of the peace treaty between Aleathia and the Empire were met. In 622 Quivum was the first major fortification captured by the *Order of the Checkered Shield*, and served as its headquarters until 695, when it became the moot of Noreashire.

The Sheriff of Norea is Tamys Bakyth, the Laranian Rekela of Perinore (see Erone). He is more than a little paranoid. Sir Tamys demands frequent random inspections of mercantylers and other travelers, often holding them without trial for long periods of questioning. It is rumored that he has spies everywhere. The sheriff divides his time between Quivum and Erone, not trusting either to a constable.

Dovan, the Hundred Moot of Narath, is also the regional headquarters of the *Order of the Checkered Shield* for the northeastern frontier. The chapter house controls extensive estates which are listed under Erone Abbey (Kanday 48). The Chabla at Menekod has petitioned the king for control of all such estates, but Sir Tamys has resisted this transfer. Both the order and the sheriff owe allegiance to the king, but Sir Tamys (supported by the Serekela) seeks to maintain these manors as church lands under his own control. The sheriff feigns friendship with the Chabla at Menekod but would prefer to see him transferred to Thay (or even Yashain).

SARKUM [D9] ②

Gemala Hundred, Selionshire, 260



The original fortification at Sarkum was built by Gemalan tribes, independent allies of Aleathia. In 384 the tribal chieftains swore fealty to King Calin. The original castle was built by Xuaka in 435.

Sarkum nobility survived the Theocracy, founding the Kingdom of Gemala in 596. The Rethemi invaded in 688, and Sarkum

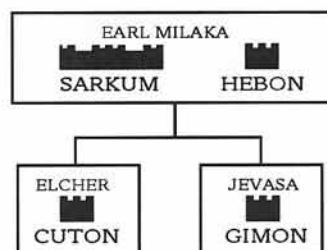
was held by them until 692 when it surrendered to the Kandians after a major fire broke out. During the occupation, two kings of Rethem, Puril and Kabe, died at Sarkum. Ranald Milaka, who had been king of Gemala, swore fealty to Andasin III and married his daughter Mirelael. When Sarkum was recaptured, Ranald was made the Earl of Sarkum by Queen Eriel. After Mirelael became queen in 694, Ranald, as consort, played an active role in rebuilding Kanday.

In 707 Mirelael and Ranald's son became Andasin IV. The earl maintains a strong influence over his son, which has caused jealousy among other great nobles, notably the Earl of Heroth. Ranald has named his second son, the king's younger brother Anaflas, as heir to the earldom. Anaflas is also the heir to the throne until Andasin produces an heir.

Ranald is fifty eight, in excellent health, and active in the politics of Kanday. He also holds KEDIS as Sheriff of Eryna. The earl desires to expand his holdings to the island of Anfla by assimilating or conquering the native Adaenum. The Milakas trace their ancestry to ancient Gemalan chieftains, who once ruled Anfla.

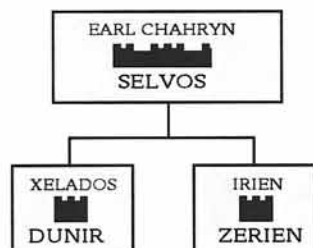
Dureve Hundred, Perishire, 580



The seat of the Earl of Selvos, and a rich fishing port in northwest Kanday.

The original castle was built by the Corani Empire as a naval station in 479 and was improved by Arlun of Rethem following his annexation of the region in 651. In 681 it was granted to the Agrikan Order of the Copper Hook. In 695 it was taken by Kanday.

The earldom was created in 698 when Mirelael granted it to Grolis Chahryn. Grolis, nearly eighty, has all but abdicated his duties to his eldest son, Temilin.



Earl Grolis Chahryn

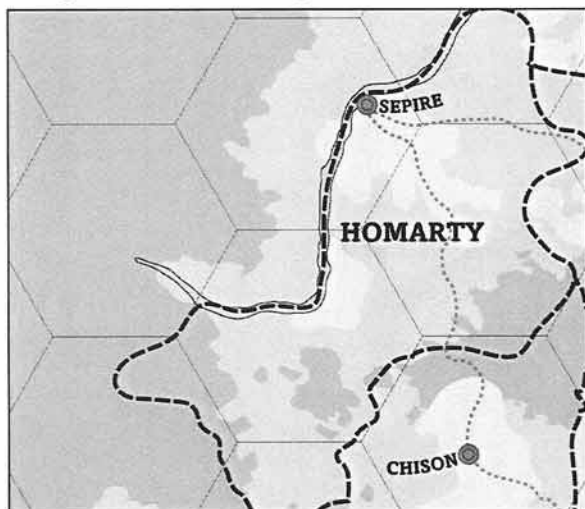

SEPIRE [E8] **Homarty Hundred, Urienshire, 325**

Sepire was originally a legion fort built during the Corani Empire. Following the collapse of the Theocracy, it became the center of the kingdom of Homarty. In 688 Hamlyn Terhune was one of the first petty kings to swear fealty to Andasin III following the fall of Sarkum and Hebon. He was made a vassal of the Earl of Heroth, which insulted him.

Hamlyn's son Kemas, the present baron, is thirty-six. He regards Andasin IV as a fool and dislikes the Earl of Sarkum.

Sepire is home to hardy folk who thrive on isolation and adversity. It is the gateway to the vast Tepr Bog and the forbidding Telous Downs, both home to a variety of rare and potent herbs, mushrooms, and insects. The Guild of Arcane Lore supports a small chantry here for the purpose of exploring and studying the mysteries of the Ternu Heath, its occupants and its fascinating weather phenomena. The chantry includes three Fyvrian and one Lyahvi Shek Pvar, some herbalists, and some learned assistants. Ilviranism hangs on here in the remoter manors.

SUMON [E7] **Horkand Hundred, Erynashire, 310**

Sumon is the gateway to southeastern Daenshire, the starting point for trappers, missionaries and merchants intent upon trading with the Gozyda. The great watchtowers at Idister and Aletyne are topped with enormous pyramids of firewood and oil to be lit in the event of attack by the Gozyda or disaster from the sea. The loneliness of these isolated vigils

is in sharp contrast to the thriving commercial hive of Sumon and its surrounding manors.

The keep was founded in 383 on the site of an ancient tribal fortification. Sumon was an independent ally of the second Republic of Aleath until annexed by Kanday in 632. The barony was created in 658.

The present baron is Antyn Udanel, an ill-tempered and sarcastic fifty-two year old. He has walked with a severe limp since a riding accident twenty-six years ago. Sir Antyn's brother Waltyn is an instructor at Maryael Monastery. The baron fancies himself a scholar, but he uses more bluster than fact in conversation.

TORTHAN [E8] 1

Alatar Hundred, Torensire, 350

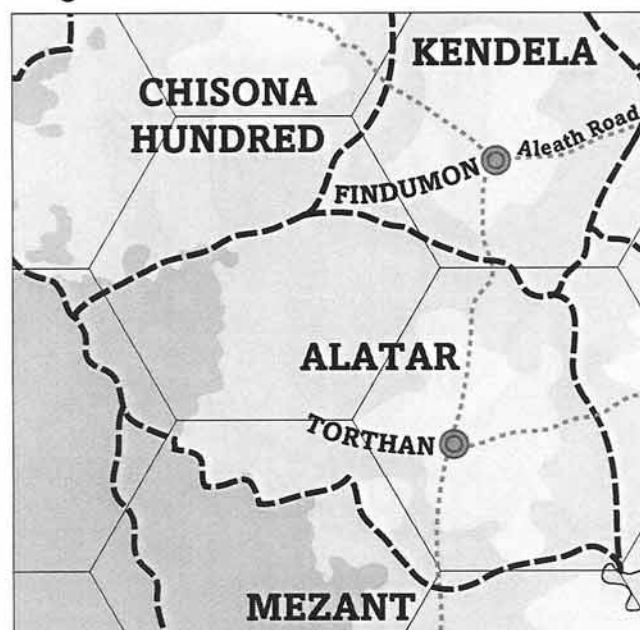
Built in 431, Torthan was the center of the petty kingdom of Alatar ruled by Clan Dargen until 687. The kingdom was in the midst of a succession crisis when the fall of Sarkum and Hebon caused most of the minor states in the area to unite with Kanday. The nobility of Alatar, seeing a chance to resolve their difficulties, swore fealty to Andasin III in 689.

Torthan is old and long-settled. It enjoys its isolation and the people actively discourage outsiders by providing them with misinformation and other petty annoyances. This has led to the common belief in Torensire and southern Uriensire that the folk of Alatar Hundred are especially inbred and degenerate. There are fanciful tales of savage secret cults that worship long-forgotten gods and practice human sacrifice.

The Sheriff of Toren is Sir Marik Dargever, a descendant of the first kings of Alatar. Sir Marek's younger brother, Varek, is married to the sister of the Baron of Pinide. Both are Odivshe Viran at Chyrefal in far-off Melderyn.

ZERIEN [E7] ①

Urmore Hundred, Perishire, 345



Founded as a Corani Empire river fort in 432, Zerien was captured for Kanday by the *Order of the Checkered Shield* in 626. It is now a barony held by Sir Petryn Irien, who is a vassal of the Earl of Selvos.

Sir Petryn Irien is fifty-three and a hardened veteran of Ezar's War. He served as steward to Marshal Grolis in the campaigns that brought Dunir,

Selvos, and Menekod to Kanday. When Marshal Grolis became Earl of Selvos in 697, Sir Petryn served as Constable of Selvos. Queen Mirelael created the Barony of Zerien as a vassal fief of Selvos in 698. Sir Petryn served as Constable of Zerien until 701, when he was granted the title Baron of Zerien.

The baron has an unusual friendship with Sir Dernik Webstal, the Agrikan constable of the Rethemi keep at Phira. The friendship originated during the Great Flood of 707 when Sir Petryn rescued a floundering boat carrying the Agrikan's wife and children. The two men often visit each other to discuss prisoner exchanges. The friendship is not supported by Sir Temilin Grolis, the politically astute young heir to the earldom. The baron is careful to downplay it when the earl's son visits Zerien each year.

Zerien is rich and fertile, a prime target for younger sons of Rethemi nobility raised on blood and ash. The Laranian fanaticism so common along the border is especially strong here. In fact it has spread to the Peonian clergy as well, who preach a particularly judgmental and exclusionary form of the faith that has caused great concern in Aleath. Those seeking sanctuary in a local Peonian temple are likely to be turned over to Laranian authorities.

CHURCH OF LARANI



The Church of Larani is one of the largest landholders in Kanday and its Rekelas (bishops) are powerful secular lords. The Rekelas hold their land from the Serekela (archbishop) of Kanday who in turn holds his lands from the king. In terms of wealth and power, the Rekelas are the equals of barons, and

the Serekela, an earl. The lands held by the *Order of the Checkered Shield* are held directly from the king.

The highest Laranian spiritual authority is the Serekela, who is answerable to the Lirrath (primate) of Hårn. The Kandian Serekela is appointed by the Sebrath (pontiff). He usually respects the wishes of the King of Kanday in making the appointment. The Serekela is also the Rekela of Daena. He is actively seeking to convert the Gozyda tribesmen to the east. He appoints the Rekelas in the other three bishoprics and sets a broad regional policy for the Rekelas to follow.

Laranian Bishoprics



The Rekelas are responsible for the affairs of the church within their diocese, and are answerable to the Serekela. Perinore includes Rethem, and the Rekela is responsible for missionaries to that kingdom. Similarly, Daena includes Tharda.

Most Laranians in western Hårn are associated with the clerical *Order of Hyvrik* or the fighting *Order of the Checkered Shield*. The Turintesa (clerical grandmaster) of the *Order of Hyvrik* is the master of the Aleathian temple of Larani. By special dispensation from the Sebrath, the Turintesa is appointed by the Serekela of Kanday.

The *Order of the Checkered Shield* enjoys the privilege of electing its Chabla (grandmaster). Theoretically under the command of the Turintesa of the *Order of Hyvrik*, in practice he is answerable to the Serekela and the king. The vast political power of this order, and its historically close relationship to the king, has led to periodic disputes within the church. There is presently a conflict between the *Checkered Shield* and the Rekela of Perinore over control of some estates in northern Kanday.

The *Order of Hyvrik* and the *Order of the Checkered Shield* maintain a tenuous foothold in the Thardic Republic. Although the Thardan chapters recognize the

authority of the grandmasters located in Kanday, they are effectively governed by "deputy grandmasters" of their own choosing.

ERONE [E7]

The first Erone Abbey was built in 453 as a Laranian monastery. Razed during the Theocracy, it was rebuilt in 623 after the *Order of the Checkered Shield* had begun its conquest of what is now northern Kanday. Its full name is the Abbey of Saint Marabrine and Saint Oswyn, "paladins" who were involved in the rise of the House of Kand. Erone is the Diocesan seat of Perinore.

The Rekela is Sir Tamys Bakyth, appointed in 711. Sir Tamys became a cleric of Larani somewhat later than is common, having been a knight in service with the Baron of Zerien until 696. His rise has been swift, aided by his abilities and powerful connections. His appointment as the Sheriff of Norea in 717 has greatly increased his secular power. See QUIVUM.

Some believe that Sir Tamys is overly concerned with secular matters to the detriment of his spiritual duties. He is fifty-six, and his speech and manner betray his early career. Possessed of a choleric temper, he is sometimes given to language that is more suited to the barracks than the cloister. There is great enmity between Tamys and the grandmaster of the *Order of the Checkered Shield*. Tamys has used both his secular power and his friendship with the Serekela to frustrate the Chabla's ambition to control all northern chapter houses. In 718, Tamys made the Reblena of Dovan, who oversees the northeast chapter houses, Bailiff of Narath Hundred. This made him doubly under the command of Sir Tamys, both as bailiff and Reblena.

Rethem is theoretically part of the Diocese of Perinore, and Tamys sometimes uses this fact to meddle in foreign policy. It is largely due to his counsel that the king officially ignores the ongoing skirmishing between the *Order of the Checkered Shield* and the Agrikan *Order of the Copper Hook*.

**Dovan has been a vassal of Erone for generations, but is now in the midst of a power struggle between the Rekela and the ambitious Chabla at Menekod. The Chabla believes the security of the kingdom can best be assured by central command of all Checkered Shield chapter houses from Menekod. In late 717, the Chabla petitioned the Serekela to transfer Dovan to Menekod. The Rekela, who is also the Sheriff of Noreashire, tightened his grip in early 718 by making Dovan the hundredmoot for Narath Hundred. The appointment was supported by the Earl of Heroth and approved by the king. The Chabla has not given up.*

KORRI [D9]

Korri is the seat of the Rekela of Ternula, the least wealthy Kandian diocese. The abbey was built in 608, but was looted during the occupation of Sarkum by the Rethemi when many of its artifacts were lost.

Rekela Carlen Milaka (Earl Milaka's nephew) was appointed in 716. He has used his family connections to finance and commence construction of a large cathedral at Korri. This will take several decades to complete and is the envy of many others in the church. The abbey's most prized possession is an ancient mummified hand purported to be a relic of Saint Ambrathas, the most important figure in the early Laranian church. Several miracles are said to have occurred in the immediate vicinity.

SHREVE [E8]

Shreve Abbey was founded by Andasin I in 620 to give thanks for his victory at Dyrisa. The original structures were completed in 632 and have been expanded many times.

Shreve is the both the seat of the Rekela of Daena and of the Serekela of Kanday, who are traditionally one and the same. Since completion of the Laranian temple in Dyrisa in 715 the Serekela tends to spend much of his time there, and it has become common to speak of the "Archdiocesan seat at Dyrisa" although this is technically incorrect.

Since 707 the Serekela has been Styfen Millard, a shrewd and scholarly man of fifty-two, who is one of Andasin IV's closest and most trusted advisors. The Serekela has supported the Rekela of Perinore over the Dovan dispute with the Chabla of Menekod.

WELUR [E8]

The present abbey was built in 612 on the ruins of an abbey destroyed during the Theocracy. The diocese of Aleathia is believed to be the earliest Laranian organization in western Hårn; its origins can be traced to missionaries among the Aleta tribes in the third century. Welur is renowned for its orchards and the high quality of the cider it produces.

Since 712 the Rekela has been Merenal Tesade, sixty-three. A minor stroke two years ago impaired his right arm and given that side of his face a distinctive cast. It also affected his speech and, according to some gossip, his mind as well.

CHURCH OF PEONI



The Church of Peoni has little interest in holding extensive secular estates. Forute is held by the *Irreproachable Order*, the male branch of the church; Chantaer and Duseda are held by the female *Order of the Balm of Joy*. These are both are held from the Sulaplyn (bishop) in Aleath who holds them from the king.

The Sulaplyn is often titled "Archbishop of Western Hârn" since Rethem and Tharda have little Peonian presence.

Chantaer and Forute are guarded by warriors of the Laranian *Order of the Checkered Shield*. The same was true of Duseda until 717, when the newly appointed Pelnala (abbess) Lorine Shambrel had the guards recalled for doctrinal reasons. Lorine is a gentle woman who was deeply troubled by the presence of armed men in their secluded community of peaceful women. Both her Sulaplyn and the Laranian Reblena (commander) of Hekra have remonstrated with Lorine on numerous occasions, pointing out the vulnerable, isolated position of Duseda on the east bank of the Eryn, but she remains adamant.

CHURCH OF SAVE-K'NOR



The Church of Save-K'Nor holds three estates near Aleath. These are held by the Ibarti (high deacon) of the Aleathian temple, on behalf of the Deor Ishar (primate) in Cherafir, who holds them from the king of Kanday. They are administered directly by the Ibarti of Maryael monastery.

Maryael is a famous center of learning and some wealthy Aleathians send their children there for education. Maryael's library is extensive and contains rare and valuable manuscripts. Although Maryael was burned during the Theocracy, little of real value was destroyed because most of its artifacts had been hidden and were later recovered.

The church in Kanday is wealthier than other kingdoms thanks to the generous patronage of King Andasin.
